

KLAMATH BUILDING ACTIVITY BOOMS

Building activity for Oregon in July, 1945, reached a new high, showing an increase of 205 per cent over June, 1945, and 1078 per cent over July, 1944.

Only Portland with \$952,125, and Salem with \$172,155 showed a greater building volume for July than Klamath Falls, and the per cent over July last year for these two cities was less than that for Klamath Falls.

Medford shows a volume of \$38,490, and Eugene \$97,229 for July, 1945.

Third Marine Group Arrives At Barracks

The third large group of marines to come to the Marine Barracks here within a week arrived Thursday morning from the naval receiving hospital in San Francisco.

The men, 305 convalescent sick and wounded, have just returned from overseas duty, most

of them from Iwo Jima and Okinawa.

Processing and screening started immediately upon their arrival at the barracks and most of the marines will leave soon for their 30-day overseas furloughs.

PROFESSED FOODS
RED STAMPS—Ration book 4—Stamps Q-2 through U-2 are valid through August 31. Stamps V-2 through Z-2 are valid through September 30. Stamps A-1 through E-1 are valid through October 31. Stamps F-1 through K-1 are valid through November 30. After these, green stamps will be used. There will be no Ration Book 3.

SUGAR—Ration book 4—Sugar stamp 36 valid through August 31. Issuance of rationing coupons halted temporarily while supply is checked.

GASOLINE—No longer rationed. Keep mileage rationing record and gasoline book to use in making tire applications.

STOVES—No longer rationed.

FUEL OIL—No longer rationed.
