# BERLIN CONDUCTOR SHOT BY OUTPOST

BERLIN, Aug. 24 (AP)—Leo Borchart, conductor of the Berlin Philharmonic orchestra, was shot to death shortly before midnight when his automobile failed to heed an American outpost's command to halt.

Three soldiers on duty shouted and waved flashlights, but the 55-year-old conductor's car sped on. One bullet struck Borchart in the head. Another man and a woman in the car were not injured.

The Berlin Philharmonic orchestra, under the direction of Borchart, has been giving concerts for allied troops in Berlin. Borchart's sister, Mrs. Margarete de Kudriafzev, who was the wife of a Russian for many years, served as a telephone operator at the American embassy here before the war.
