

# 700 CELEBRATE HOUSE OPENING AT WAREHOUSE

MALIN—Celebrating the completion of a \$32,000 potato warehouse built by Jacobs, Malcolm and Burt, San Francisco produce firm, Jerry Rajnus, Malin, local representative, was host at open house in the building Saturday night.

Seven hundred guests, representative of all communities of the Klamath basin, were entertained at a dance and refreshments. Music was furnished by a local orchestra.

The building, located on the Great Northern, is of two stories insulated construction. It is one of the largest in the basin, and is equipped with modern sanitation features, running water and lighting. It has a capacity of 60,000 sacks.

The firm will employ 45 or 50 during the grading and storage season and will operate three graders. Potatoes only will be handled this year.

Members of the firm here from the bay area for the opening were Joe Moyce, president; Bert Jacobs Jr., vice president; and Mrs. Jacobs; his father, Bert Jacobs Sr., Ed Sculley, Clarence Skevic and Carl Thomas, all of San Francisco, and Grant Hunt, Oakland representative.

Thomas will spend some time here in the future in the interests of the business. Rajnus is a well-known potato grower and buyer of the Malin community. Ed Brostherous, Klamath Falls, was contractor.

## Wheat Prices Vary Little In Week

PORTLAND, Aug. 27 (AP)—Bid prices on wheat at the Portland grain exchange last week varied from unchanged to somewhat lower on ordinary classes compared with a week ago, the U. S. department of agriculture said today.

The cash wheat market here did not echo the strength in midwestern wheat futures prices. Posted bid prices at Portland, however, were regarded as mostly nominal, because prices at country points—based on warehouse receipts—were about 2 cents a bushel higher.

ASTORIA, Aug. 27 (AP)—Fishermen today hailed as a glimpse of the future the new Seattle tuna clipper, the Astorian, skippered by Olaf Johnson, Astoria. The vessel has a beam of 22 feet and is 84 feet long. Powered by a 450-horsepower motor, it has a cruising radius of 7500 miles. The 10-man crew can handle 130 tons of fish. Fuel tank capacity is 15,000 gallons.

## Coroner's Jury Holds Death Accidental

KIMBERLY, B. C., Aug. 27 (AP)—A coroner's jury yesterday held that the death of Charles Leroy Bechtel, 66, of Ta Ta Creek, B. C., was accidental while resisting arrest.

Bechtel, wanted on a warrant issued for persons allegedly mentally ill or dangerous, held off seven police officers for four days before he surrendered with a flesh wound in the abdomen. He died in a hospital Friday.

## RELOCATION PLANS PUSHED AT TULELAKE

TULELAKE—To speed up plans of Japanese-American residents of the Tulelake center for relocation, a district relocation office was opened by WRA Monday morning.

A tremendous increase in applications for information on resettlement has followed announcement of the ending of the war. Hundreds of center residents are making plans to leave.

Relocation records show that more persons have left the project in the first three weeks of August than during the two preceding months. Between December 31, 1944, and the first week in this month, 20,981 Japanese left the nine centers for resettlement. Of the total, 8448 returned to their homes or otherwise resettled in the four western states of California, Oregon, Washington and Arizona.

Resettling in California were 6467; in Washington, 1014; Oregon, 852, and Arizona, 115.
