

BUILDING TO HOUSE ONLY BAKERY, SHOP

The corner building at S. 7th and Walnut is being entirely remodeled to house the Fritsch bakery and Poole's bicycle shop. The building was purchased last spring by the two concerns from the Beardsley estate.

Bakery Layout
Fritsch's bakery will occupy the corner two stores which are being converted into one store, and will have retail counters in the front which is being reconstructed with large glass windows facing Walnut and S. 7th. The bake rooms will be entirely separated from the retail section. Work is expected to be finished by October 1.

The two corner stores were formerly occupied by Van Dorn's glass brick concern, and Claude H. Davis' linoleum, carpet and window blind shop.

Mr. and Mrs. Louis Fritsch established their bakery business in Klamath Falls eleven years ago when they came here from Salem.

Bicycle Shop Plan
Poole's bicycle shop will occupy their present location and the store now used by the bakery, dividing the building in half, each new owner taking over two stores. Mr. and Mrs. Clarence A. Poole came here from Salem in 1933 and have operated the bicycle shop ever since. Poole plans to connect his two stores, knocking out the partitions between to make one large building. Work of remodeling his section will probably be started this fall, Poole said.

Concerns Move
Van Dorn has moved his glass brick business to the west end of Oak street, and Davis has purchased the Willits building now occupied by the OPA, where he expects to move his business as soon as the building can be vacated.

Kansas City Reports Year's High In Cattle

KANSAS CITY, Aug. 28 (AP)—The cattle run at the Kansas City stockyards was estimated at 30,000 head yesterday, the largest volume of the year. Of these 28,000 were salable.

The salable peak on cattle last year was 24,936 head on October 30. The local market established a world's record of 47,196 head on October 18, 1943.

Fat steers from Kansas and Oklahoma pastures comprised a liberal proportion of the receipts, but more than a third was from the western ranges.
