

REDUCTION IN DEATHS SEEN DURING WEEK

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30 (P) Revisions and deletions in combat casualties reported by the armed forces today produced a reduction of 274 from last week's total.

The new figure, which is not final, is 1,070,545 as against 1,070,819 for the preceding week. The current total includes 923,284 for the army and 147,261 for the navy.

The army report represented a decline of 197. The navy total dropped 77.

A breakdown on army casualties and corresponding figures for last week:

Killed 201,126 and 199,656; wounded 571,346 and 571,179; missing 31,461 and 33,543; prisoners 119,351 and 119,103.

The war department reported that 358,807 have returned to duty and 96,970 of the prisoners have been exchanged or returned to military control.

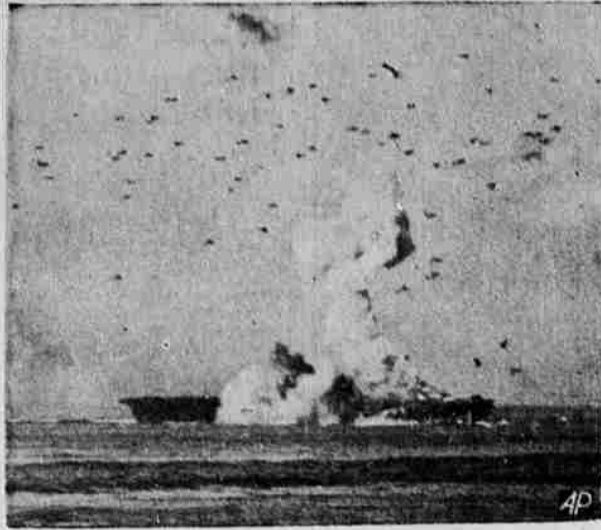
Similar figures for the navy: Dead 53,359 and 53,229; wounded 79,843 and 80,039; missing 10,428 and 10,426; prisoners 3631 and 3644.

Logger Killed By Falling Snag

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 30 (P) The death of another firefighter in the gigantic Tillamook blaze was disclosed today. William Thomas, 53, Seaside logger, died Tuesday en route to an Astoria hospital. A falling snag struck him while he was fighting fire 20 miles from Tillamook.

Reporting all blazes under control today, State Forester Nels Rogers said, barring a strong east wind, present fires can be kept within their boundaries.

Oregon To Add To Record Spud Crop

CORVALLIS, Aug. 30 (P)—Western states are helping to produce what is expected to be the third largest potato crop in history, Oregon State college extension service said today.

The service reported Oregon, Washington and Idaho had shipped 2600 more carloads by August 18 than in the same period last year.

Western states are expected to produce 116,000,000 bushels of a total national crop of 420,000,000 bushels.

Capt. L. L. Lind, who inspected northwest sites in Puget Sound area and Portland and Vancouver, reported maintenance of the reserve fleet would require about 1800 enlisted personnel and 200 officers. Most of the craft will be "thin skinned" vessels from 100 to 350 feet long, he said.

MINISTER WARNS JAPS ON CONDUCT

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 30 (P)—Gen. Sadamu Shimomura, Japan's war minister, today cautioned his defeated countrymen to avoid any "shameful acts" during the allied occupation of their homeland.

Shimomura's Tokyo radio broadcast, recorded by the federal communications commission, was directed to the armed forces and civilians alike.

He urged the people to increase food production, hasten Japan's reconstruction and obey the emperor.

The war minister announced the withdrawal and disarming of Japanese troops from Manchuria, Korea, Karafuto, For-

mosa and elsewhere was proceeding smoothly.
