ARMED SERVICE ENLISTMENTS TO BE RESUMED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 31 (AP)—The way was cleared yesterday for resumption of enlistments in the armed services on a voluntary basis.

President Truman issued an executive order yesterday vacating an order of December, 1942, which suspended voluntary enlistments for the duration.

3-Year Basis
Voluntary enlistments in the army will be on a three-year basis, the same as before the war. The navy's prewar "hitch" was six years, but the navy disclosed today orders had gone out reducing the first enlistment term to four years.

The army announced recently that any man in the army now who reenlists would be given 90 days furlough at home, and any now in the army by voluntary enlistment who reenlisted would be entitled to reenlistment bonus.

Army Limit
The statutory limit on enlistments in the army is 280,000 men, but congress is expected to raise this soon.

OSC SEES RECORD CO-ED ENROLLMENT
CORVALLIS, Aug. 31 (AP)—Oregon State college looked worriedly today at a prospective record-high co-ed enrollment, and warned the rest of the girls they might not find a room here.

With 1850 applications from girl students, 233 more than the college has ever had, President A. L. Strand announced that no more rooms could be promised.

"We are not telling the girls that they can't come to college, if they can find a room," said Strand, "but our space in group housing cannot be expanded to accommodate more."

The college still has space for more single men. It is attempting to obtain 40 prefabricated houses from Richland, Wash. to expand scarce family living quarters.

Japs Quibble Over Prisoner Releases
ABOARD USS ANCON OFF YOKOSUKA, Aug. 31 (AP)—The Japanese commander objected when rescuers sought to evacuate prisoners from the Oromi camp near Tokyo.

"I must have the approval of higher authority," he informed Rescue Commander Commodore Roger Simpson and the prisoners' own leader, Cmdr. W. F. Mather, Chicago, formerly gunnery officer of the cruiser Houston.

"You need no more authority—we are the authority," was Simpson's quick, firm reply. And out went the prisoners.

Search Planes Fail To Find Lost Craft
FAIRBANKS, Alaska, Aug. 31 (AP)—A dozen search planes scouted 150 square miles yesterday but failed to find trace of a plane piloted by William English and carrying Swen Gustafson and Miss Adele Johnson, missing since Saturday night on a flight from Circle Hot Springs.

The plane was last heard heading for Fairbanks through rain at 9:30 p. m. Saturday. English is the son of a Wiseman trader, Gustafson is from Anchorage and Miss Johnson is a worker at Ladd field.

Navy Cuts Point Quota For Aviators

WASHINGTON, Aug. 31 (AP)—The first major break in the navy's point system for demobilization came today in an order reducing the number of points required by naval aviators for release to 44.

All other male reserve officers need 40 points. The new point score for aviators is the same as that for enlisted men.

LEND-LEASE FROM RIVER AREA TO END

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 31 (AP)—Lend-lease to Russia from the Columbia river area will end with the signing of Japan's surrender, the war shipping administration area director announced today.

George Powell said between 40,000 and 45,000 tons of soviet lend-lease cargo will still be in Portland, Vancouver, and Longview when the program ends. Only two Russian ships are now loading, one here, and one at Longview. Two other soviet ships in port are idle.

Surplus cargo will be disposed of by government agencies which have handled it, Powell said. The army cargo has almost all been loaded, he said; but the navy is expected to have a surplus which will go to the Spokane navy storage warehouse.

Oregon Justices To Return To Work

SALEM, Aug. 31 (AP)—The seven Oregon supreme court justices will go back to work next Tuesday after their summer vacation.

One of the court's first pieces of business will be to act on the petition for rehearing of Andrew W. Dennis, Portland, sentenced to die for slaying his mother-in-law.

The court upheld his conviction last spring, but the petition for rehearing was filed while the court was on vacation.
