PROCESSED FOODS
BLUE STAMPS—No longer rationed. RED STAMPS—Ration book 4. Stamps Q-3 through U-2 are valid through August 31. Stamps V-2 through K-1 are valid through September 30. After these, green stamps will be used. There will be no Ration Book 5.

SHOES—Ration book 4—Sugar stamp 36 valid through August 31. Insurance of clothing sugar coupons halted temporarily while supply is checked.

SHOES—Book 3—Airplane stamps 1-2. 3-4 now valid.

GASOLINE—No longer rationed. Keep mileage rationing record and gasoline book to use in making tire applications.

STOVES—No longer rationed.

FUEL OIL—No longer rationed.
