

POLICE ARREST FAITH HEALERS IN VIRGINIA

NORTON, Va., Sept. 6 (AP)—The Rev. Harvey O. Kirk, of nearby Ramsey, Va., was arrested late last night on a charge of manslaughter in connection with the death of his wife, Anna, who died Monday after she was bitten by a rattlesnake at religious demonstrations of "Faith Healers."

Also taken into custody were three of the sect members—Paul Dotson, Leander Ely and John Wilson—on charges alleging they "unlawfully and feloniously" brought poisonous snakes to a religious demonstration at Stone Creek Saturday and allowed them to be turned loose among spectators and sect members and that one of the snakes bit Mrs. Kirk, causing her death. The 26-year-old woman died six hours after her baby was born prematurely. The child lived 20 minutes. Dr. G. T. Foust, who signed the death certificate, gave the cause of death as rattlesnake bites.

EUROPE FACES GRIM WINTER IS REPORT

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6 (AP)—President Truman was told today that Europe "faces a very grim winter, with unrest and possible chaos" unless relief can be expedited.

The report was given by Herbert H. Lehman, director general of UNRRA, who returned Saturday from a two months' visit to Europe.

Lehman said he was hopeful that congress would soon appropriate \$550,000,000 to complete the \$1,350,000,000 expenditure it has authorized as the United States' share in the immediate relief program.

He also expressed hope that congress will authorize another \$1,350,000,000, estimated by UNRRA as its share of an enlarged relief program envisaged after a recent survey.

Gerges Pleads Guilty To Charge

Peter John Gerges pleaded guilty in justice court Wednesday to a charge of driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor and was fined \$100 and costs by Justice J. A. Mahoney.

Gerges was arrested by state police Tuesday on Summers lane.

7 Million Japs To Be Demobilized

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 6 (AP)—About 7,000,000 Japanese soldiers and sailors will be disarmed and demobilized by mid-October, and 18 American divisions will police Japan—leaving approximately 120,000 other Americans free to go home, NBC Correspondent Merrill Mueller reported today from Yokohama. Mueller said that 18 army divisions, plus air forces units, service troops and supporting naval forces needed to occupy Japan will total about 400,000 army and 100,000 navy men. "This means about eight divisions" now in the Pacific can go home, he added.

Truman Warns On Wage Cuts, Strikes

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6 (AP)—President Truman today cautioned employers and labor unions against using the peacetime transition period either for slashing wages or fomenting strikes.

In that connection, Secretary

of Labor Schwelienback arranged a luncheon meeting today to fix the place and date of the conference and to designate a committee to plan its agenda. Schwelienback invited Secretary of Commerce Wallace, AFL President William Green, CIO President Philip Murray, Eric Johnston, president of the United States chamber of commerce, and Ira Mosher, president of the National Association of Manufacturers.

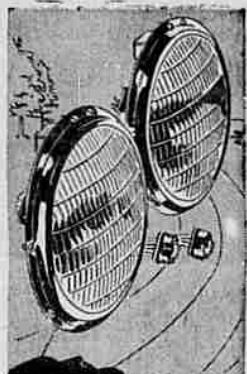

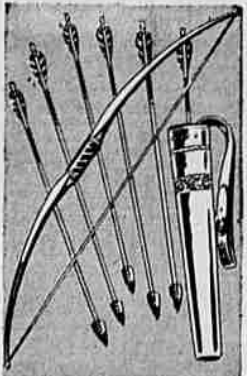
