

NAVY YARD AIR RAID SHELTER MADE PUBLIC

BREMERTON, Wash., Sept. 6 (AP)—An enormous concrete air raid shelter at Puget Sound navy yard, to hold 10,000 persons when there was danger of Japanese raids and undisclosed publicly until today, is being converted to peacetime uses.

Buried deep inside a hillside is a 1050-foot main tunnel with four connecting laterals making a total tunnel length of 2200 feet. The tunnels, 18 feet wide and 12 feet high, have an independent lighting system for emergencies and a complete drainage system.

Reminiscent of the time when their caution might have been necessary, signs on the walls request "Quiet Please" and "No Smoking." At intervals along the walls are escape hatches, perpendicular concrete shafts, giving access to the hilltop.

One of the four portals has been converted into a telephone center for ship personnel, another is being turned into a ship's service store, and the main tunnel is used as storage space.

AUGUST WEATHER SETS HIGH MARK

The weather report from the U. S. bureau of reclamation for August, 1945, showed a mean monthly temperature of 68.7 degrees, the highest for the month in three years. Over a period of 40 years the average mean for August is 66.9 degrees.

August 21 and 22 were the hottest days of the month with a recorded temperature of 91 degrees. Four days later, the coldest day of the month was recorded with 37 degrees.

There was no precipitation at all for the month this year, the first August without a trace of moisture since 1937 and 1938 when no rain fell in that month. Normal for August is 0.24 inch.

Only three cloudy days were recorded, 12 partly cloudy and 16 clear days.

Jap Base Transfer Terms To Be Set

ABOARD THE U. S. S. PANAMINT, OFF NORTHERN JAPAN, Sept. 6 (AP)—Japanese authorities tonight notified Vice-Admiral Frank Jack Fletcher that the chief naval officer of Ominato naval base, Rear-Admiral Zensuke Kanome, and three other Japanese officers will be dispatched aboard the coastal defense ship Kozu early tomorrow for a rendezvous with Americans to arrange terms for the transfer of the Ominato base. The meeting will be at a designated spot off the coast of northern Honshu.

General Predicts Transport Speeds

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 6 (AP) Commercial air transport speeds of 400 to 500 miles an hour in the not too distant future are envisioned by Lt. Gen. Harold L. George, commanding general of the army air transport command. The ATC chief, commenting on the 12-hour flight time from Washington, said the war-accelerated development of aircraft makes the dreams of five-hour trips from New York to the Pacific coast "tomorrow's reality." differential between the coasts, this flight would take only two business hours, westbound.

OIL DRILLING AT BURNS IS PLANNED

Drilling for oil will start at Burns in a few weeks, it was learned today. Construction of camp buildings is completed, water wells have been dug, equipment is on hand and erection of a derrick will start immediately.

Businessmen in four Oregon cities formed the United Company of Oregon, Inc., last December and, as soon as weather permitted, started construction of the camp at Burns.

J. H. Dawson of Medford, president of the company, stated the location was selected because of favorable reports of the territory by geologists, checked over a period of 30 years.

Although another company drilled a well in 1940 about two miles from the United company's site without bringing in oil, directors of United believe that the work was not done properly, nor was the well drilled deep enough.

Vice president of the company is W. J. Crank, lumberman, of Klamath Falls; manager, J. E. Zuber, Medford; assistant manager, Glenn Bowen, Eugene; secretary-treasurer, L. Gilman, Medford; directors are Ralph Greenwood, Klamath Falls, and Mathes, Central Point.
