

Rotary Club Offers Sweepstakes Cup To Champion 4-H Club

Klamath Falls Rotary club is offering a revolving sweepstakes cup in order to stimulate group activity among 4-H club members at the junior livestock show to be held at the fairgrounds September 10-17. The cup is offered to the 4-H livestock club making the best all-around showing.

Judging of the cup will be based on the percentage of members showing; herdsman-ship, which includes appearance of exhibitor, animals and pens; sportsmanship; premiums won; completeness of record books.

The club has announced that all livestock must arrive at the fairgrounds between 8 a. m. and noon, Sunday, September 10. Weighing, fitting and preparation of stock will continue all day. Hay and straw will be furnished by the fair board. Grain and other concentrates must be furnished by exhibitors.

Judging and showing will be held Monday from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m., followed by a barbecue, presentation of awards from the grandstand, and concluding with an auction sale at 7 p. m.

There will be no individual sales of sifted stock by exhibitors, it was stated.
