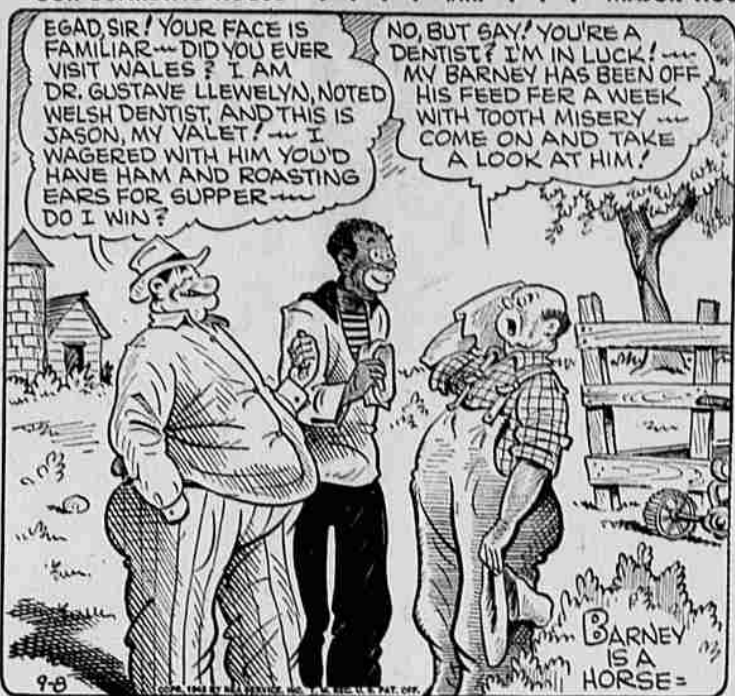

Northwest Colleges Eye Opening Of Grid Season

Washington U. Loses Wealth Of V-12 Material; Oregon, OSC Appear Even

The Pacific Coast conference northern division dusted two years' accumulation of dust off its football uniforms today and reported for practice—the first since an enforced wartime layoff for all but the University of Washington.

Huskies Lose Material

But the Huskies' interim title will not give them any edge on the returning squads in the way of material since the wealth of V-12 material afforded the university now either has gone into the navy or to other schools.

Thirty-five new candidates are expected today, though, which, added to the summer crop, should give Coach Ralph (Pest) Welch a squad of about 70. Bobo Moore, two-year letterman, and Don Hoff, ex-serviceman who handled a tackle post on the 1941 freshmen eleven, are among veterans expected back. Former Willamette backfield ace Don Rochon is expected to strengthen the Husky running attack.

Two workouts have been scheduled by Welch in preparation for the season opener three weeks from today against the University of Oregon.

Newhouser Tops Yanks; Cubs Slide

Barring a baseball miracle, the American league race has narrowed down to a two-way stretch between Detroit and Washington with St. Louis, New York and Cleveland on the brink of elimination.

Only unexpectedly strong comebacks by the Browns, who are six games back, and the Yankees, who trail by 6½ lengths, could save them from the disaster suffered in their series with the Senators and Tigers. St. Louis has only 22 to play and New York 23.

McSpaden Still Leads Dallas Open

The field was cut today as Harold (Jug) McSpaden, the big transplanted Kansan, headed into the final 38 holes of the Dallas \$10,000 open golf tournament with a two-stroke lead and high hopes of becoming a front runner for a change.

McSpaden, broad-shouldered professional registered from Sanford, Me., who is second high money winner of the year with \$22,000 by Byron Nelson's \$52,000 although he hasn't been able to finish on top in a tournament since August of 1944, recovered from a shaky start that saw him go three over par on the first five holes yesterday to come romping in with a bristling 69 and a half-way total of 137.

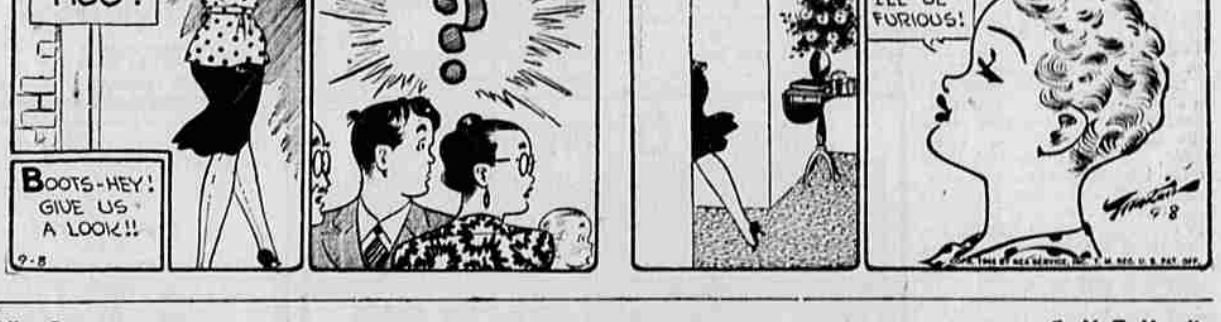
