

Tigers Split Double Bill With Boston

Nats Miss Chance To Move Into Tie For First Place By Dropping Nightcap, 9-4

Detroit remains out in front in the American league scramble today because Washington ran into a dose of its own night ball medicine in Earl Caldwell, a midnight specialist from Chicago whose fast one dips and darts in the moonlight.
After routing the White Sox, 10-4, in the first of a two-night doubleheader by the simple method of scoring seven times in the first inning, Clark Griffith's Moonlight Saving boys ran into Mr. Caldwell's magic and succumbed, 9-4.
The win would have boosted the Nats into a virtual tie with the Bengals, although they still would have trailed by a couple of skinny percentage points, but the split left them a full game back.
Nats Miss Opportunities
All is not lost in the nation's capital, because Detroit heads that way this weekend but a golden opportunity had been missed. The Senators have only 14 more games to play to the Tigers' 18, five against Washington.

Detroit opened the most important week of its pennant drive without the services of Hank Greenberg who had a sprained ankle and Eddie Mayo who was suffering from a bruised rib. They must play nine games in the next six days, including three doubleheaders.
Steve O'Neill had to be satisfied with an even split in Boston yesterday and had to scramble to get that. After bowing to Dave Ferriss who notched his 21st triumph in the 9-2 opener, the Tigers just did shadow Emmett O'Neill on a first major league hit by Eddie Mierkiewicz, a rookie just recalled from Buffalo. The score was 2-1, much too close for comfort for Stubby Overmire and Prince Henry Cana who relieved him.

Yanks Stop Tribe
The Yankees proved they are not as bad as their recent actions would indicate when they stopped Cleveland's Al Smith, 5-1, on Charley Keller's grand slam homer in the seventh. Ernie Bonham's five-hitter did the trick in addition to snapping a five-game losing streak New York took over third place by a percentage point over St. Louis when the Browns bowed to the Athletics, 5-3, after taking the first game, 3-2 on Vern Stephens' 21st homer.

Billy Southworth's persistent Cardinals continued to hang on Chicago's coat tails, knocking over New York, 2-1, at night after Rookie Ed Wright of Boston had shut out the Cubs, 2-0, in the afternoon. The combination of events sliced the Bruin's margin to 23.
Harry Breechen did the job on the Giants, a six-hitter, for his 12th victory. The crafty left-hander has shown remarkable form since he shook the miseries out of his arm in mid-July, dropping nine out of 10 and sweeping only a 2-1 game to Boston.

Bums Drop Reds
Brooklyn squeezed past Cincinnati, 3-2, with the help of rain that forced the game to be called in the eighth and resulted in postponement of the second tilt. Nick Strincevich tossed Pittsburgh to a 9-5 decision over the Phillies due to seven rainings by rain. A scheduled second game was put over until today.

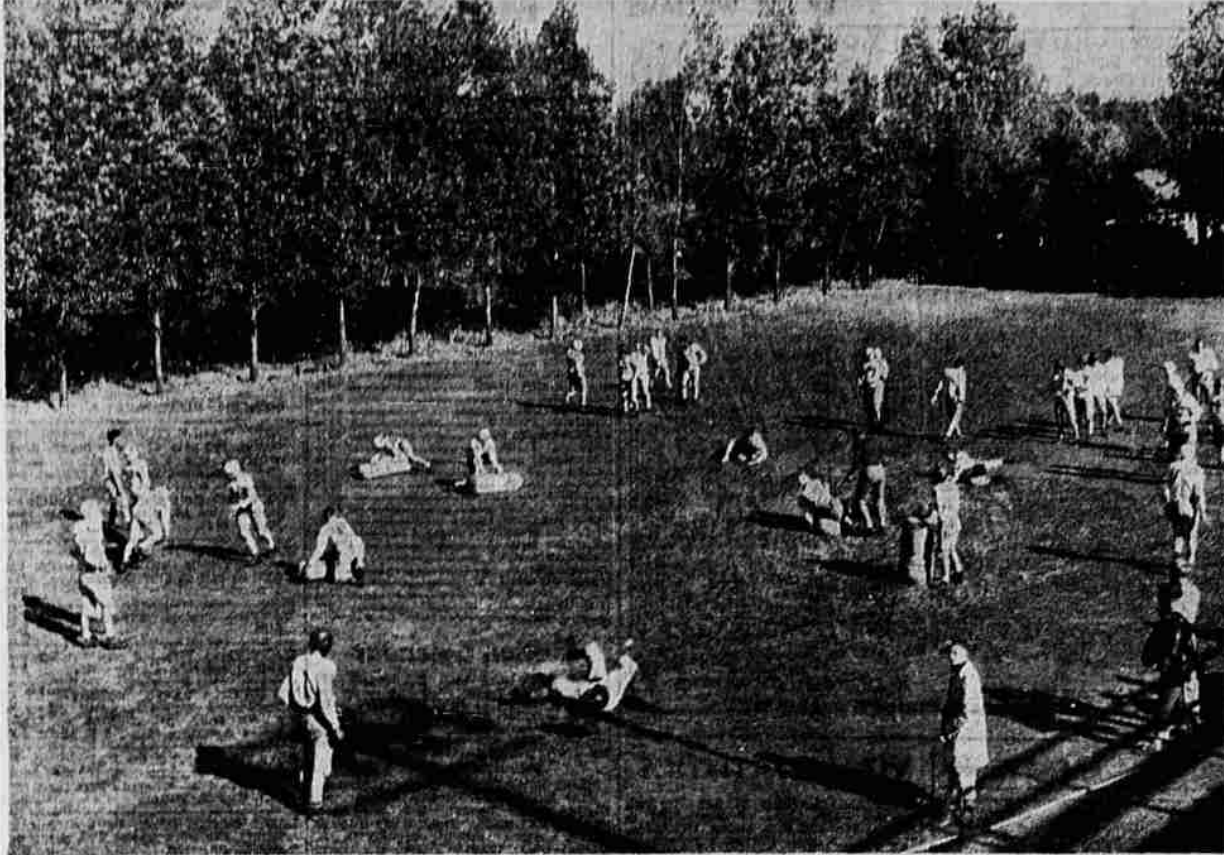
Major Loop Hit Parade All-Chicago

Tommy Hooton of Boston, who led most of the season, is Cavarretta's only threat in the national but Cuccinello has the whole American league field nipping at his heels.
Cavarretta, just returned to the Cubs lineup after being sidelined by a shoulder injury, will be under constant pressure as the Chicago club drives toward a pennant.
Cuccinello faces an added obstacle in the rule that necessitates at least 400 at bats for a champion batter. He must play in 10 of the remaining games to qualify even if he can hold the lead.

Commission Investigates Garden Bout

NEW YORK, Sept. 11 (AP)—For the first time in the new Madison Square Garden's 20-year history, the state athletic commission today was investigating the outcome of a fight—a fight in which the loser said he was offered as much as \$20,000 to throw the bout.

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NAVY SOFTENS 11'S FOR ARMY

BALTIMORE, Sept. 11 (AP)—The old argument over the value of comparative scores in selecting football winners is due for the acid test when Army and Navy tangle in the service classic at Philadelphia December 1.
The two service powers, already generally picked to fight it out again for national honors, have no less than five mutual opponents carded this fall, including four—Duke, Notre Dame, Michigan and Penn—which figure to be major tests. The fifth,

Villanova, should be a shade easier—on paper, at least.
The score searchers picked up some prestige last fall when they unanimously selected Army over Navy on the basis of games both played against Duke, Penn and Notre Dame. Both picked up three victories, but Army did it by much larger scores, and true, to comparative form, drubbed Navy 23 to 7 to annex the national championship.

The former New Mexico State coach arrived yesterday, after release from the navy. He and John Warren, varsity coach in 1942, will assist Head Mentor Tex Oliver.

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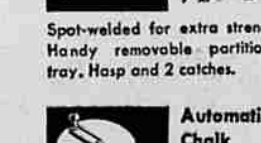
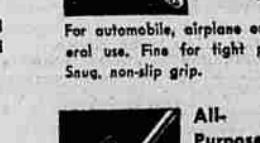
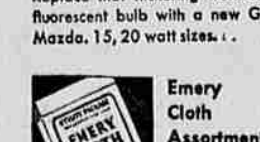
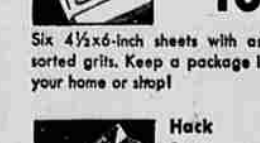
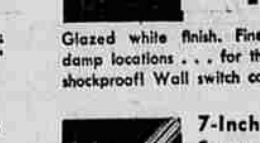
