Farrell whose prime interest in earlier years was baseball... and no one even dreamed of him becoming a writer... is a resumption of the battle of books. Under different leaders, the controversy that waged in the thirties over "humanism" is being fought once more... and Farrell explains why some stories happened to be written.

Rather racy, but satisfying... Lester Cohen's latest novel, "Coming Home." The author of "Sweepings" has laid this story in Pittsburgh... where a young couple and their baby are pitted in battle against a steel tycoon, a ward heeler and a moral-weary police officer.

And, last... a couple of timely editions Shaw's recommends for any library... a collection of stories, articles, verses that are "The Best from Yank," the Army Weekly... amusingly illustrated... and a U. S. pictorial camera annual, "U. S. at War."

MOTORISTS TO GET AVIATION GASOLINE

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 13—For the first time in the history of the oil industry an actual government specification aviation gasoline will be made available to the motoring public of the Pacific coast during the next two weeks.

According to a Union Oil company announcement released today the company is already shipping out "91/96 aircraft engine fuel" to be put on sale at key stations. This gasoline is the

same fuel the company delivers to the armed forces and the aviation industry under federal specification AN-F-26.

Company officials say it is light blue in appearance—the regulation color for high-grade aircraft engine fuels—and that it will sell for a few cents more than ethyl.

According to Reese H. Taylor, president of Union Oil, any car will be able to use the company's new gasoline but only those with high compression ratios will get the maximum return in performance which the fuel is capable of delivering.

Taylor went on to add, however, that this super-fuel will unquestionably usher in a new era in automotive engineering—one in which the high-speed, high-compression automobile

motor capable of delivering far more horsepower per pound will completely supplant the car we know today.

PICK-UP BURNS

MALIN—A pick-up owned by Fred Lentz was partially destroyed by fire Wednesday morning while being filled with gasoline at the Shell station here. Lentz had failed to shut the motor off and was pumping gas into the tank when the machine caught fire. No damage resulted to the station. The Malin fire department responded to a call but the flames were under control.

German Mines Kill 2000 French Monthly

PARIS, Sept. 13 (P)—Accidents in German-planted minefields are taking a toll of 2000 deaths every month in France, the war ministry announced today. It estimated that 100,000-200,000 more of the buried weapons were yet to be removed. A spokesman said crews made

up of German prisoners of war and French civilian volunteers were losing one man for every 5000 mines made harmless. Paper "cans" with a lining of plasticized glue have been used successfully as containers for motor oil.
