Key To Problem

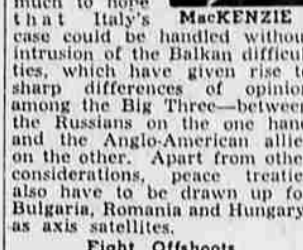
