

DAMAGE SUIT SLATED FOR TRIAL TODAY

A jury trial in a damage suit in the sum of \$10,000 against the Crane Mills and Ralph E. McCumber is scheduled to be heard by Judge David R. Vandenberg in circuit court here today. The plaintiff in the case is Bessie Opal Reeves.

She charges in the complaint that on September 13, 1944 she fractured her left arm, received a cut on her chin, and suffered

severe shock as the result of an automobile accident which occurred approximately two miles southeast of Ely. It is alleged that the cut on her chin resulted in facial disfigurement and the function of her arm was permanently impaired.

Truck Parked
It is charged in the complaint that McCumber parked a truck belonging to the company on the highway after dark and failed to warn other approaching vehicles by means of flares. The plaintiff was riding in a car operated by Hazel M. Todd and collided with the rear of the truck as the result of the alleged negligence of the truck driver, McCumber. Hazel M. Todd is also instituting suit in the total sum of \$5500 against the Crane Mills and Ralph E. McCumber for injuries received in the accident and for damage to her car.

PARENT-CHILD BOND URGED BY LAMOTT

TULELAKE—Robert Lamott, executive of the Boy Scout Modoc council, guest speaker at the Rotary luncheon recently, urged a closer bond between parents and children in the nationwide need for correction of juvenile delinquency. His topic was "What Does Youth Need." He laid the blame for the alarming increase in youth crime to lack of interest of parents in the church and to the breakdown of adult moral ethics.

14 MILLION SET FOR NORTHERN ROAD-BUILDING

WASHINGTON, Sept. 17 (AP)—Oregon and Washington are slated to receive more than \$14,000,000 a year in a three-year federal road-building program which shortly will be under way.

A concurrent resolution to make effective the highway act of 1944, which authorizes expenditure of \$500,000,000 a year for three years, will be presented to the house this week.

Unanimous approval of the resolution was predicted by Chairman Robinson (D-Utah). "And it will be approved by the

senate within 20 minutes after that body receives it," he added.

"Obligate" Funds
The resolution alone will set the wheels in motion. There will be no want for a congressional appropriation under terms of the highway act. That will come later. The road bureau may "obligate" federal funds to cover contracts entered into by states for highway construction. The obligated money will be

turned over to the states when appropriated by congress.

Federal funds are to be matched by the states in varying degrees, depending on the area of public lands within their boundary.

The public roads administration has fixed the following federal allocations for states each year: Washington, \$7,399,002; Oregon, \$7,084,363.
