

# Sari Hurt In Friday Scrimmage

### Stellar Pelican Lineman Has Recurrence Of Injury That Put Him On Sidelines

Bad luck struck in the Pelican camp Friday afternoon when Bill Sari, who is certain of a starting berth at tackle, injured the same knee that put him on the sidelines last season.

It is not known whether or not Sari's injury will incapacitate him for this year. Coaches Paul Angstead and Ed Ryan are hopeful that Sari was not hurt seriously and that he will be able to play in the opening game with Grant Friday. The injury occurred while the Pelicans were holding a scrimmage session.

The Generals will be sparked by Bill Gabriel, quarterback, Don Stamm, right end, and Pete Withers, right guard, when they invade Modoc field to do battle with the Klamath eleven Friday night.

All three boys are veterans of last year's squad, but with the exception of these three gridders and Gerald Smith, another experienced man, the Generals will field a green team.

Jim "Mush" Torson, Grant coach, has been putting his charges through rigorous paces in the past two weeks to prepare them for their forthcoming tussle with the K-men.

On Modoc field the Pelicans swing into their final week of practice prior to the opening clash and Coaches Paul Angstead and Ed Ryan are working hard to perfect a polished attack and an adequate defense against the Portland eleven.

The backfield which appears likely to start the fracas is Leroy Coleman at the quarterback slot, Bob Redkey and Herbert Barker in the halfback berths, and Tommy Edwards at the fullback position.

The line presents a more wide-open selection but Dee Nelson and Chuck Thurman appear to be certain starters at the flanks. Bill Sari is a cinch at a tackle spot, Harold Wirth will handle a guard assignment, and Roger Vanderhoff will probably start at the pivot position.

The entire squad is progressing nicely and with three more drills scheduled after today, the Pelicans should be ready to go by kickoff time Friday night at Modoc field.

Frail Backfield

## Tigers, Bruins Loom As Rivals In Series

It looks like Detroit and Chicago, after a 10-year wait, will meet again in the October world series.

Time is running out on their rivals. With but two weeks of the current campaign remaining, it appeared today that only a spectacular spurt by either of the two runner-ups, Washington's Senators or St. Louis' Cardinals, together with a complete collapse on the part of the leaders, could eradicate the leads of the front running Tigers and Cubs who last met in the 1935 classic.

Cubs Hold Big Lead

Including yesterday's double triumph over Brooklyn, 3-2 and 4-2, which incidentally erased the Dodgers last mathematical chance for the National league pennant, the grizzly Bruins boasted a four game lead over the world champion Redbirds, with each team having a dozen games left on the calendar. Of these, five are against each other.

The Tigers own a two-and-a-half game edge over the Senators in the American league, with nine games left to play and six for the Nats.

Chicago's twin-victories before a crowd of 40,187 came as St. Louis was splitting two games with Philadelphia and marked the Cubs' 18th sweep of a doubleheader this season to better the old major league record of 17 held by the Cards.

Two Tough Games

Neither triumph was easy for the Cubs. In each contest they were forced to break a 2-2 deadlock to win. Ray Prim and Hank Wyse were winning hurlers, the latter becoming the first Cub pitcher to win 20 games in a season since Claude Passeau did it in 1940. Peanuts Lowrey's run-scoring single in the fifth won the opener while Wyse himself started the Cubs' winning rally with a double in the seventh of the nightcap.

The Phillies came from behind to edge out the Cards, 4-3, in the opener when Manager Ben Chapman singled in two runs in the role of pinch hitter. The Cards won the nightcap, 10-3, clubbing five Philly hurlers for 15 hits.

Tigers Chill Nats

The Tigers chilled Washington's pennant hopes by halving the doubleheader with their chief rivals. With a throng of 29,500 cheering them on, the capital city challengers downed Detroit's southpaw ace, Hal Newhouser, in the opener, 3-2, but the Bengals barged back to squeeze out a 5-4 decision in the closer and take a 3-1 edge in the series.

Roger Wolff knuckle-balled a five hitter in the first game to gain his 19th triumph, but Johnny Niggeling failed to follow suit. At that, the Nats rallied from 5-0 deficit to tally four runs in the last two frames and had the tying run and winning runs on base in the ninth when Dizzy Trout was summoned from the bullpen to retire Pinch Hitter Mike Kreevich for the final out. The two teams meet tonight for the last time this season.
