

SPECIAL GIFT COMMITTEE TO SOLICIT FUNDS

Campaign Chairman W. E. Lamm for the Klamath community fund drive, announced that first activity in the 1945 program will be contacts by the special gift committee.

A group of men headed by A. M. Collier will contact business firms and certain individuals to secure subscriptions, completing this portion of the drive prior to the general solicitation which will be held in October.

Assisting Collier on the committees are Mitchell Tillotson, Malcolm Epley, J. Vern Owens, C. A. Henderson, E. H. Thompson and Lamm.

To plan final details of the drive, a meeting of the executive board of the fund will be held Wednesday at 4 p. m., at the chamber of commerce, with division chairmen.

Funds from the drive are used to finance local, state and national agencies including USO, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, Campfire girls, Salvation Army and about 30 other organizations.

\$12,000 HAUL OF LIQUOR PROBED

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 19 (AP)—Liquor control agents were investigating bootlegging operations yesterday after arrest of two truck drivers and seizure of \$12,000 worth of liquor hauled illegally from Los Angeles.

State Liquor Administrator Ray Conway said the 324 cases of pint bottles seized near Milwaukie yesterday was the largest on state record.

Clackamas County District Attorney Stanley Mitchell ordered the two drivers, Fred Vargas Stockton, Calif., and Robert V. Harrison, Los Angeles, Calif., held pending investigation.

Vargas' bail was set at \$6000; Harrison's at \$6000—a total approximating the value of their cargo.

The cargo was detected by State Patrolman Henry Kacenski, who halted the truck because it lacked a license plate.

Navy To Sell Surplus Raincoats

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19 (AP)—A navy raincoat will cost \$15 at retail and a navy pea jacket \$22.50.

The OPA today set these ceiling prices for about 500,000 raincoats and 35,000 pea jackets which have been declared surplus.

A pea jacket is a short, double-breasted coat made of heavy cloth and lined with corduroy.

FIVE ACRES BURNED BY FOREST BLAZE

ROSEBURG, Ore., Sept. 19 (AP)—An incendiary forest fire, which had it not been quickly controlled, would have destroyed the Thunder mountain logging operations of the Youngs Bay Lumber company, was reported today by Fred Southwick, supervising warden of the Douglas Forest Protective association.

The blaze burned over about five acres opposite Hog's Back, about 30 miles east of Roseburg before being brought under control.

Fire fighters discovered that the fire had been set by using a ball of binder twine saturated in kerosene, Southwick reported. Law enforcement agencies are aiding the forest patrol in an investigation.

Seattle To New York In 10 Hours

SEATTLE, Sept. 19 (AP)—A 10-hour flight from the Seattle-Tacoma airport to New York City will be inaugurated by United Airlines through route changes and use of fast planes, the firm said yesterday.

The airline's transcontinental mileage will be reduced 250 miles, it said, chiefly through a cut of 119 miles in the Seattle-Boise route and a shift in range stations on the Idaho-Wyoming cutoff.

The changes have been approved by the civil aeronautics board examiner.
