

ICC ASKED TO PROBE RATES IN NORTHWEST

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (AP)—Senator Wheeler (D-Mont.) today requested the interstate commerce commission to extend its investigations of freight rate structures to include the Pacific northwest.

The commission several weeks ago ordered class freight rates in the south equalized with those in the east.

Different Rates
In a letter to Chairman John L. Rogers of the ICC, Wheeler said the commission has prescribed rates for the northwest only in a "piecemeal manner." This, he asserted, has resulted in several rate structures, all of which differ from each other in level and scheme.

"As a consequence of such conditions," said Wheeler, who is chairman of the senate interstate commerce committee, "some shippers and localities are more favored than others, such a freight rate situation has had its effect upon the economic diversification of the region and has contributed to the noticeable tendency to concentrate population and industry along the coast or in areas immediately adjacent thereto."

Added Cost
"Today the raw materials are shipped east to be manufactured and then the manufactured articles are shipped west, adding greatly to the cost of the manufactured articles," it continued.

"If the northwest is to be successful in developing more manufacturing and processing within the area, it must look to the establishment of freight rates which will be conducive to that end."

MONTH ASKED FOR FUND CAMPAIGN
PORTLAND, Sept. 20 (AP)—A proposal to designate December as a month for Oregon communities to launch campaigns for war memorial funds was before Gov. Earl Snell today.

The Oregon committee for living war memorials also urged all cities and counties to formulate programs for creating suitable memorials. The committee approved a \$50,000 gymnasium at Central Catholic high school in Portland and an \$85,000 stadium at Albany as suitable projects.

Truman To Ask For Polio Funds
WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (AP)—President Truman will carry on the Franklin D. Roosevelt tradition of broadcasting an appeal January 30 for funds to fight polio. That is the late president's birthday.

Basil O'Connor, president of the National Infantile Paralysis Foundation, disclosed today and said the drive next year will include memorial concerts in the various cities instead of the customary "birthday balls." The March of Dimes and other forms of money-raising will continue. Drives last January netted over \$16,000,000.

Seabrook, Author And Explorer, Dies
RHINEBECK N. Y., Sept. 20 (AP)—William B. Seabrook, 59, American author and explorer, was found dead in bed today at his Dutchess county farm here.

His wife, the former Constance Kuhl, said an autopsy would be performed to determine the cause of death. She said the author apparently was in "good health" when he retired last night.

VETS ENLIST UNDER NEW ARMY PLAN

Maj. L. E. Feehley, infantry, army district recruiting officer for Oregon, declared today that many men who have been discharged from the army of the United States on points, are taking advantage of the new enlistment plan for the United States regular army, which was inaugurated on September 6, 1945.

Under this plan, men who had a regular army status on or prior to June 30, 1941, may be enlisted in their regular army grade and immediately appointed to any higher temporary grade held at time of discharge.

U. S. army recruiting stations are located in the post office building at Klamath Falls, Eugene and Salem, Ore. Headquarters of Oregon district is located at 614 SW 11th Ave., Portland 5, Ore., where enlistments are also accepted.

BATTERED BODY OF N. Y. WAVE WASHED ASHORE

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 20 (AP)—The badly battered body of Mary Joan Dunn McDermott, auburn-haired wave from Dobbs Ferry, N. Y., was recovered late Tuesday from the waters of the Golden Gate.

City and county officials, who launched an immediate search

for her slayers, estimated the 23-year-old wife of a navy officer on duty in the Pacific had been slain and her body tossed from the 236-foot-high Golden Gate bridge.

Badly Bruised
The girl's body was washed ashore on the Marin county side of the Golden Gate. Coroner H. O. Howitt said the girl was dead before she hit the water. She had a punctured lung, three broken ribs and internal injuries. Her nose was broken and her face badly bruised.

Mrs. McDermott's landlady last saw her Saturday when "she left to take a bundle to the laundry and take a walk." Homicide department inspectors reported she had been seen later on the Presidio approach to the bridge.

The twelfth naval district said she was the wife of Ens. George

E. McDermott, aboard an attack cargo ship in the Pacific. Her father is Maurice J. Dunn, Dobbs Ferry.

The girl was clad in blue slacks and blue denim jacket. She wore a plain gold wedding ring and a snake band set with sapphires on her left hand and a man's silver ring with a blue stone on the right.

TO START HOME
BERLIN, Sept. 20 (AP)—The 82nd airborne division will start home soon. It is to be replaced October 15 for Berlin occupation by the 78th infantry division.

The 82nd, which took part in three land and four airborne operations in North Africa and Europe, relieved the second armored division in Berlin August 1.
