

ARCHDUKE TO GIVE ADDRESS HERE SEPT. 26

The Archduke Felix of Austria will be the speaker at the first dinner meeting of the new Klamath Knife and Fork club, to be held at the Willard hotel September 26, next Wednesday.

John Houston, president of the club, said the group is highly pleased at the first meeting arrangements, and predicted Archduke Felix will provide an intensely interesting talk on the subject, "Re-Building Europe."

The dinner will be held at 6:45 p. m.

Scion of the Hapsburg family which has played a dominant role in Europe for six and a half centuries, the Archduke Felix recently returned from a trip to South America and a renewal of his acquaintance with the undercurrent of affairs in war-torn Europe. He came back to the United States with first hand information on the world situation.

The archduke's excellent command of English and his clear presentation of his subject matter contributed to his outstanding public speaking in behalf of a democratic Europe before his American audiences. He is over six feet tall, 26 years old, whose delight in his low priced American automobile, American coffee shops and soda fountain lunches has enabled him to quickly adapt himself to the democratic American way of life.

Franz-Joseph, the aged emperor who ruled Austria-Hungary when the Sarajevo assassination precipitated World War I, was his great-grand uncle. The Archduke Felix was a cadet at the Austrian West Point—Wiener Housat—at the time of Hitler's invasion. He barely escaped with his life by dashing an automobile through a nazi police border guard. A cousin was placed in a concentration camp, and later was reported dead.

Agent Will Provide Tin Cans For Overseas Gifts

September 15 to October 15 are the dates for mailing Christmas packages to men and women in service without request. Servicemen liked the food that was sent to them last year, sealed in tin cans and asked for more. Mrs. Winifred E. Gillen, home demonstration agent for Klamath county, will furnish tin cans for mailing food and will seal and tag them at a nominal cost, just as was done last year.

Fruit cake that was baked at home in a No. 2 tin can last September arrived in Belgium in good condition in December, according to one report. The soldier who received it wrote home for another just like it. Chocolate cookies, sealed in a tin can, were sent to a sailor in the South Pacific and arrived in good condition three months later.

A soldier in France wrote that the canned fudge that he received last Christmas was very good. It had been poured into a tin can while warm and sealed.

Among other homemade foods that the homemakers have successfully mailed overseas are honey cookies, divinity candy, applesauce fruit cake, candied nuts, spiced nuts and dried fruit. Recipes and directions for overseas mailing, can be obtained at the office of Mrs. Gillen, room 208, in the Federal Building.
