

# CHAMBER URGES SIGNALS FOR RR CROSSINGS

Chamber of commerce directors today voted to urge installation of railroad crossing safety signals at the Hager crossing of the O. C. and E., and the Altamont drive crossing of the same railroad.

The action was taken in connection with a similar safety proposal by the junior chamber of commerce. The junior chamber has proposed that a wig-wag signal, now located on the old Keno-State Line road crossing, be moved to the Hager crossing on the Merrill highway. The chamber favored this proposal, and added that similar protection is needed on Altamont drive.

The old Keno-State Line road has been closed and the wig-wag is no longer needed there, it was said.

The chamber received a telegram from Senator Guy Cordon stating he was taking up with the chief of naval operations the matter of a long-time navy program on the Klamath airport. Cordon said he hoped something could be worked out.

Another telegram from Cordon carried the information that oral argument in the west coast airlines case before the civil aeronautics board is set for October 22, instead of October 8.

## FRONTIER CHANGE REVEALED BY SOVIET

BERLIN, Sept. 20 (AP)—The German-Polish frontier has been changed from the line announced by the Russians July 10 to give the Poles several hundred additional square miles west of Stettin on the Oder river. Marshal Zhukov told Polish emissaries upon his return yesterday from Moscow that the new line runs from Ahlbeck to the western bank of the Oder opposite Gjeufenyaven.

The section awarded includes the oceanic port of Swinemunde, the old Slavic island of Wollin, the synthetic gasoline manufacturing city of Poeslitz and the fishing towns of Neuwarp and Zeigenort. Approximately 12,000 Germans still in the area will be evacuated.
