

BENEFITS FOR REGULAR ARMY ENLISTEES TOLD

The U. S. army offers many inducements to eligible men who desire to enlist in the regular army now.

Among the many benefits given to the enlistees of today are those under the GI bill of rights.

The GI bill of rights offers financial aid by guaranteeing loans for farms, business enterprises, etc.; hospital benefits and educational benefits and many other benefits.

Educational aid for veterans is provided by the veterans administration provided: (1) you were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable; (2) you were not over 25 at the time you entered the service, or can demonstrate that your education or training was interrupted or interfered with by your service; or if you desire a refresher or retraining course; (3) you served 90 days or more or were discharged or released from service because of an actual service incurred injury or disability and (4) you start such education not later than two years after discharge or the end of the war whichever is the later.

You may choose any course you desire, subject, of course, to the acceptance of the educational institution.

The veterans administration will pay to the educational or training institution the customary cost of tuition, laboratory, infirmary and similar payments as are customarily charged, and may pay for books, etc. It will not pay for board, lodging, travel and other living expenses. Such payments shall not exceed \$500 for an ordinary school year.

The veterans administration will also provide a subsistence allowance of \$50 a month if you have no dependents, \$75 if you have. Adjustments are made on

ST. HELENS, Ore., Oct. 4 (AP)—A baby flat top, the U. S. S. Rendova, undergoing river trials, went aground on a sandbar in the Columbia river near here today.

The ship, recently completed by Willamette Iron & Steel company, developed steering gear trouble, dropped anchor, and drifted aground at low tide. Capt. Leland D. Whitgrove, superintendent of shipbuilding for the navy at Portland, said no apparent damage resulted.
