

INDIANS TO GET OCTOBER PAYMENT

A \$200 per capita payment to members of the Klamath Indian tribe, is expected to be made in October, it was announced today by Superintendent B. G. Courtright of the Klamath Agency.

Courtright said it would take over \$300,000 to make the distribution of per capita shares. The date of payment depends on when the money is placed at the U. S. treasury regional office in Portland by treasury headquarters in Washington, D. C., but payment is expected before October 25.

There is also some prospect of a per capita share of \$1000 being made this winter or next spring, but these plans are indefinite, Courtright said.

Pair Fined For Giving Liquor To Minor Girls

Marvin Powers, 20, and Hershel Foster, 23, changed their plea from innocent to guilty in justice court Friday on a charge of wilfully and unlawfully giving intoxicating liquor to minor girls.

They were fined \$50 each or 25 days in the county jail. Both are now incarcerated in lieu of fine. Another boy, William Foster, 19, had pleaded guilty to the charge earlier and is also being held in the county jail in lieu of \$50 fine.

10th Led Drive To Finish Italy

When the final drive to clear German forces from Italy was launched early in 1945, the Tenth Mountain division was chosen as the spearhead.

The Tenth did not have long to wait in Italy before getting into action. It had been there less than a month before it was in the line in one of the toughest sectors of the Fifth army front. It was given the task of dislodging crack German mountain troops from the heights of Mount Belvedere. Weather conditions were terrific, but that didn't bother the Tenth. The doughboys who fought through the snowy passes and over gale-swept peaks were, for the most part, famous American skiers, climbers, forest rangers, park and wildlife servicemen.

After chasing the Krauts from Belvedere, the Mountaineers turned on full pressure and broke through the formidable defense lines in the Apennine mountains near Bologna. Fighting above the clouds most of the time, the Tenth is credited with having cleared the last of the mountain barriers in Italy and paving the way for armored elements of the Fifth army to pursue the Germans in the Po valley.

One of the Tenth's heroes was Sgt. Torger Togle, world champion ski jumper, who was killed in action early in 1945. A buddy of Togle's said the ski champ died "fighting a one-man campaign to repay the nazis for the hardship and indecencies visited

President To Be Best Man At Clark Wedding

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6 (AP)—President Truman left today for Berryville, Va., to act as best man at a wedding—first engagement of a five-day, six-state trip. Before departing at 9 a. m. (EST), Mr. Truman added Reelfoot lake, west Tennessee's favorite rendezvous for fishermen, to his itinerary. The chief executive started his journey by automobile but later will use a plane.

Besides his official party, the president was accompanied by Mrs. Truman and their daughter Margaret. The latter planned to return to Washington from Berryville later in the day.

First on his schedule was an engagement at 11 a. m., today as best man at the wedding of Bennett Champ Clark, former Missouri senator and now a judge of the U. S. court of appeals for the District of Columbia.

Judge Clark will be married at the Grace Episcopal church, Berryville, Va., to Violet Heming, the actress.

BIDDING RENEWED IN STOCK MARKET

NEW YORK, Oct. 6 (AP)—Hopes for quick settlement of widespread labor disputes threatening reconversion inspired renewed bidding in today's stock market with demand centering on specialties and pivotal industrials.

Advances of fractions to as much as three points or so predominated near the close and eight-year highs were plentiful. Transfers ran to around 700,000 shares for the two hours.

Prominent on the swing during the short session were U. S. Steel, Chrysler, Goodrich, Sears Roebuck, Douglas Aircraft, Great Northern, Air Reduction and Eastman Kodak. Rails, utilities and oils were relatively narrow.

Occasional losers included American Smelting, Montgomery Ward, Woolworth, Allied Chemical and General Electric. Bonds were fairly steady.
