Black Tornado Rolls Over Scrappy Eugene Team 52-7

Medford's Black Tornado, riding toward a second state prep football championship, struck the well-defended town of Eugene last night and wreaked a 52-7 score of destruction.

The blast ended Eugene's string of eight straight victories, two of them this season. But the Axemen, strongest opponent to face Medford so far, left a dent in the defending state champion's record. Medford is no longer unscathed-upon.

Klamath Falls knocked out another undefeated, unscored upon record by downing Ashland, 14-6, in the first southern Oregon conference game. The two squads now stand even, with two victories and one loss each. Grants Pass climbed into the same bracket with a 20-0 blanking of Coos Bay.

Grant Whips Roosevelt

At Portland, Grant knocked over defending champion Roosevelt, 7-0, to lead city standings along with Washington. Washington downed Franklin, 26-13. Corvallis chalked up its second victory in the no-name league by defeating Springfield, 26-7. The twice-defeated Salem Vikings overcame Albany, 14-7, in their first no-name tilt.

A powerful eleven from The Dalles clinched a third straight win within the state, dropping Bend, 14-7, in a traditional contest. Hood River, another prime contender for the eastern Oregon crown, triumphed 42-12 over Prineville. Baker and Mac Hill broke even, 6-6, in the only Blue Mountain game.

Newberg Humbled

Newberg, Tualatin-Yamhill titlist for three straight years, tumbled off the pedestal last night in a 32-0 defeat by Beaverton. The two top contestants fulfilled predictions—the Hillsboro powerhouse blanking Tigard, 28-0, and McMinnville walloping Forest Grove, 34-6, to stay on the undefeated list.

Down tri-county league way, defending champion Cottage Grove swamped Junction City.
