

JAP - AMERICANS SEEK ALLEGIANCE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10 (AP)—Some of the Japanese-Americans who renounced United States citizenship at the start of the war have changed their minds and now are seeking an opportunity to pledge allegiance to this country.

A justice department official disclosed today that several letters have been received from such individuals interned at the Tule Lake, Calif., segregation center.

The requests have been "comparatively few" in relation to the 4000 to 5000 Japanese who refused to take the oath of allegiance to the United States and are being detained at Tule Lake, the official said.

Some of the Japanese assert, it was learned, that they were over-persuaded, particularly by propaganda influence, to renounce U. S. citizenship. Now that they face deportation to Japan, they desire a chance to regain the citizenship they say they lost without full consent of their individual wills.

Others base their plea on "hardship" issues, claiming illness or other factors that would endanger their travels.

The requests are "being considered" by the justice department but there is little evidence in official quarters that they will be granted.

MARSHALL WARNS OF DANGERS AHEAD

(ADVANCE) WASHINGTON, Oct. 10 (AP)—General Marshall cautioned Americans today that a rich nation which lays down its arms in this age of terrifying and fantastic new weapons courts catastrophe.

The chief of staff said the United States should maintain a regular army, national guard and reserve of trained civilians so huge it could mobilize 4,000,000 men within a year.

Not Stint Funds
It should not stint funds for intensive scientific research, Marshall asserted in his biennial report to the secretary of war, at a time when methods of attack hitherto unpublished may subject New York, Pittsburgh, Detroit, Chicago or San Francisco to a rain of annihilation from points thousands of miles from this continent.

Here is what Marshall thinks this country should do:

Provide money and means for continuous research into the military ramifications of man's scientific advance.

Provide a permanent peacetime citizen army, built around a corps of men who have received one year of compulsory military training.

Encourage the national guard—it is "in the first category of importance" in the citizen army.

Maintain Army
Maintain a regular army composed primarily of a strategic force, with emphasis on air power, part of it deployed in the Pacific and Caribbean.

Keep the training program abreast of technical developments and the resulting modifications of tactics.

"To prevent another international catastrophe," Marshall declared, "there is no alternative but that this nation must be prepared to defend its interest against any nation or combination of nations which might sometime feel powerful enough to attempt settlement of political arguments or gain resources or territory by force of arms."

Purely Idealistic
"In the past," he said, "we have ignored the hard realities of world affairs. We have been purely idealistic."

Marshall insisted that any hope for lasting peace must be predicated on the ability to enforce it with strength. He said the state department believes that a decision now to adopt universal military training would greatly bolster this country's efforts to obtain world organization.

SALMON HATCHERY SYSTEM INADEQUATE

PORTLAND, Oct. 10 (AP)—A special committee, back from a 1100 mile inspection tour, told the State Fish Commission today that Oregon's facilities for artificial production of salmon are totally inadequate.

The commission-appointed committee reported that thousands of dollars are needed to remodel the state's hatchery system.

Arlie Suomela, fish commission agriculturist, was directed to make recommendations to restore the dwindling salmon supply. One of his first tasks will be to locate sites for new hatcheries and holding ponds.

Post office officials here have had a problem since the bus service between Klamath Falls and Medford has been tied up. Buses had been taking air mail from here to meet the Medford plane. The problem has been partially solved by sending air mail on north or southbound trains where it is picked up in San Francisco or Portland, Mail to Medford and other valley points is being sent to Eugene or Weed where it is transferred to trains.

Southern Pacific has again put a passenger train on its line from Dunsmuir to Ashland and Grants Pass and trains both north and south are full to capacity.

Little Increase
Taxicab companies have reported very little increase in the number of their occasional trips to Medford, but drivers did say that people who are on their way to the bus depot order drivers to rush them to the railroad station when reminded of the bus tie-up.
