HEADWAY GAINED IN MINE INFERNO

VERNAL, Utah, Oct. 11 (AP)—The inferno of flame that belched from the Bonanza gilsonite mine following two terrific explosions Tuesday night is gradually being brought under control, a company official said today.

The blaze in the No. 2 shaft, in which the explosions occurred, was smothered by thousands of tons of dirt which workmen laboring on eight-hour shifts dumped into the mine, located 50 miles southeast of here, near the Utah-Colorado border.

L. D. Barry, who manages the mine for the Barber Asphalt company, said dirt was poured into other shafts also and the 50-man crew was gradually winning the fight to save the isolated but modern mining town of Bonanza.

BATTLE CASUALTIES IN WAR DROP 371

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11 (AP)—The count of battle casualties in the war dropped 371 today to a total of 1,070,153 as more names were stricken from the columns of the missing.

Army casualties, as reported to the war department through Oct. 7, were 922,583—an increase of 107 over last week. The navy's total is 147,570, a decrease of 478.

Army figures for this week and for a week ago: killed 207,754 and 206,622; wounded 571,490 and 571,664; missing 21,510 and 22,552; prisoners 121,829 and 121,638.

The navy figures: killed 55,449 and 54,988; wounded 80,240 and 80,247; missing 9,783 and 10,259; prisoners 2,118 and 2,556.

Four persons are killed each hour in traffic accidents in the United States.

PORTLAND, Oct. 11 (AP)—A protest of charging tuition fees for high school studies by war veterans whose education was interrupted by draft calls was before the city board of education today.

A serviceman's group told the board last night the fee asked of veterans over 21 years of age was "a discouraging penalty" and urged the state pay the tuition.

Eugene K. Oppenheimer, chairman of the state department of veterans' affairs advisory committee, said numerous veterans were paying tuition because they are over 21 years of age after leaving the services.
