

# EFFORT MADE TO RUSH TAX BILL THROUGH

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11 (AP)—The house called its members to work two hours earlier than usual today in an effort to pass before midnight a \$5,300,000,000 tax cutting bill.

The measure, which also must be approved by the senate, would do this beginning January 1:

1. Guarantee every individual income taxpayer a reduction of at least 10 per cent. Total cuts for individuals would amount to \$2,627,000,000.
2. Sweep 12,000,000 low income persons off income tax rolls completely. When the war ended there were approximately 50,000,000 individual taxpayers.
3. Lower corporation tax burdens \$1,888,000,000 by trimming the effective rate of the war-imposed excess profits tax from 85.5 to 60 per cent, reducing the combined corporation normal and surtax from 40 per cent to 36; and repealing next July 1 the declared value capital stocks tax. The bill calls for repeal of the excess profits tax January 1, 1947.

4. Cut back next July 1 the high wartime excise levies on such things as liquor, furs, jewelry, luggage and cosmetics, at a saving of \$33,000,000 to consumers in the last half of 1946. Some \$160,000,000 in taxes on floor stocks under excises also would be refunded to business.
5. Repeal the \$5 automobile use tax, next July 1, relieving the burden on automobile owners by \$140,000,000.

**Freezes Social Security**  
The legislation also freezes the social security tax in 1946 at one per cent each on employer and employee. Without the freeze this tax would jump January 1 to 2.5 per cent.

As the house made ready to act, the bill came under vigorous attack from the CIO and 14 other organizations including the Farmers Union.

The 15 organizations addressed letters to each house member declaring the legislation would "grant huge windfalls to the most prosperous corporations" but permit "only meager relief to low and middle income groups" of individuals.

The letters urged outright repeal of the three per cent normal tax on individuals and increased exemptions to put much softer burdens on low and middle income groups.

## ARMED JEWS RAID PALESTINE DEPOT

JERUSALEM, Oct. 11 (AP)—The Palestine headquarters announced today that a large number of armed Jews raided the Palestine training depot early this morning, overpowered the guard and fled with a quantity of weapons and ammunition.

The raid resulted in a sudden increase in tension which had been reported lessening last night following the arrival of several thousand British reinforcements and the withdrawal of police cordons around the villages of Beth Oren and Yagur.

Police had encircled the towns in an effort to capture 200 Jews who killed one British constable and injured an Arab and a Jewish policeman as they fled from the clearance camp where they had been detained for illegal entry into Palestine.

Meanwhile, in Tel Aviv, a police communiqué said police were stoned by "a large mob" when they sought to carry on "a routine search."

## Oregonians Permitted To Board Navy Ships

PORTLAND, Oct. 11 (AP)—Oregonians will be permitted to board naval vessels here during the Navy Day celebration October 27, Lt. R. K. Stanton, navy public relations officer, said today.

The city has allocated downtown berthing space on the west side of the Willamette river for two light cruisers, two destroyers, a light cruiser and three submarines which will arrive beginning Monday.

CORVALLIS, Oct. 11 (AP)—Oregon State college Dad's Day will be held here Saturday, coincident with the Oregon-Oregon State football game.

The college committee sent a cordial invitation to the dads, but warned them to "bring their own picnic lunch." Restaurants are jammed, said the committee.

## INTERNEE ADVISED OF SON'S DEATH

NEWELL—Hyoee Kurokawa, native of Hiroshima, Japan, devastation of which by the atomic bomb began the ending of the war with Japan, has received word from the war department that his son, T/4 Satoshi Ben Kurokawa, was killed in an airplane crash near Okinawa August 13, along with 25 other U. S. army personnel. Kurokawa is a resident of the war relocation authority's Tulelake center here, and believes that his two brothers and their families were killed in the atomic bomb attack on Hiroshima.

Ben Kurokawa was born in Guadalupe, Calif., in 1922 and attended high school at Santa Maria with the class of 1940. He entered the army in April of 1944, was graduated from the Army Intelligence Language school, and on the mission on which he was killed—the plane crashed on the west coast of the Philippines to Okinawa—he was serving in the capacity of interpreter-translator for the army intelligence service.

His father received word from Col. Sidney F. Mashbir informing him that Ben was killed while being flown from the Philippines on an assignment of the first importance, and for which he had been selected only a few days before because of the special qualities he possessed.

## 24th Remembers Pearl Harbor

The 24th Infantry division really remembers Pearl Harbor. It was on Oahu when the Japs threw their sneak punch, but before the Japs threw in the towel, the men of the 24th had hit the enemy 12 times—at Hollandia, Biak, Panson, Leyte, Mindoro, Marinduque, Subic Bay, Fort McKinley, Lubang, Romblon, Simara, Verde and Corregidor.

The 24th landed in New Guinea early in 1944 for the Tanahmerah-Hollandia operation. In four days the division had wrested the vital Hollandia airrome from the enemy. Elements of the 24th then went to Biak and aided the 41st division in capturing Corrido and Boroce airstrips.

On Leyte the men hit "Red" beach on D-Day, with mountain guns spraying the beach and mortar, machine gun and small arms fire raking the dunes. For 78 straight days, a Pacific record at the time, the men of the 24th were in constant combat, and they killed a counted 7179 Japs.

With little or no rest, elements of the 24th went to Mindoro as part of a task force, while others landed and secured Marinduque. One of its regiments, the 34th, was attached to the 38th division and spearheaded that outfit when it landed above Subic Bay at the top of Bataan peninsula. One battalion of the 34th was given the honor of making the amphibious assault on Corregidor.

400 EXECUTED  
LONDON, Oct. 11 (AP)—About 400 German war criminals and collaborationists have been executed and another 400 sentenced to terms ranging from 10 years to life. Poland's Attorney General George Sawicki said here today.

Another 8,000 cases are being prepared for prosecution, he said.
