

PITTMAN WILL BACK CORDON'S LAND MEASURE

Senator Guy Cordon's proposed congressional measure to secure federal financial contributions for localities having large tracts of untaxable government land will receive the all-out support of Governor Pittman of Nevada, County Judge U. E. Reeder announced today.

Reeder, along with Judge F. L. Phipps of The Dalles, secretary of the Association of Oregon Counties, and Forrest Cooper, attorney for the group, has been in conference with the Nevada governor in an effort to gain backing in the western states for the legislation.

Bringing Nevada into accord with Oregon on the Cordon bill is a major step forward, Reeder believes, because the measure has been referred to the senate committee on public lands, which is headed by Nevada's Senator Pat McCarran.

"We needed someone who could get McCarran's ear in the

matter," Judge Reeder said, "so I believe that our trip to Reno was well worth the trouble."

The bill would provide for a fair appraisal of all public lands, and payment of two per cent of that appraisal yearly into the counties where these lands are located. That money would be a contribution in lieu of taxes and go into funds for schools and roads.

Under the present setup, counties get no revenue from government owned and controlled lands and local tax money, earmarked for schools and roads, are carried in proportion to the amount of such land located in the county.

Public Lands

Klamath county contains almost 70 per cent public lands and about 52 per cent of the entire state of Oregon is untaxable government property, Reeder said. If Cordon's measure becomes law each county having public lands will have a fixed amount of additional revenue coming into its treasury each year.

The Association of Oregon Counties, which is an organization of various county officials, are ardently backing the measure here and Governor Pittman is desirous of forming such an organization in Nevada. He plans to start forming his group in January, with the aid of Phipps and other Oregon county leaders, and have their first meeting in February.

DISTRICT RANGER ISSUES WARNING

Extreme caution in building warm-up fires this last week of the 1945 deer hunting season, is urged by District Forest Ranger John Sarginson.

The season will be closed October 28, Sarginson reminded hunters, and with the sharp turn to colder weather, many warm-up fires will be built this next week. Not enough rain has fallen to remove the fire hazard in the woods, he said, and warns against making fires against rotten logs, drifts of leaves and brush.

Fires made in such places may be put out to all appearances, Sarginson said, but can smoulder along for hours and burst into flame much later, when the hunters are far away from the place.
