

# Klamath Men Urge Favorable Action In Airlines Case

Senator Marshall Cornett and Phil Hitchcock of Klamath Falls were in Washington today at the opening of final hearings before the civil aeronautics board on the combined west coast airlines case.

The Klamath men went to the capital on assignment by the city of Klamath Falls and the aviation committee of the chamber of commerce. Hitchcock is director in charge of the latter group. Their purpose is to urge Klamath's interest in favorable action on application of a major airline to serve this community.

**Apply for Permission**

Both United Airlines and Western Airlines have applied for permission to establish major service here. A CAB examiner, Merritt Ruhlen, recommended against these applications, and instead favored a feeder line service by Southwest Airways. The Klamath men went east armed with an extensive brief, prepared by the chamber and city airport commission.

Klamath also is interested in favorable action on an application of Nevada-Pacific Airlines to establish feeder line service connecting this city with Lakeview and Boise on the east and Alturas and Reno on the south. Jack Mayne, secretary of the Lake county chamber of commerce, is at hearings to urge the Nevada-Pacific case.

The CAB will make a final decision following the hearings which opened today.

**Other Applications**

Involved in the consolidated west coast case were applications by American Airlines, Coast Aviation corporation, Los Angeles Airways, Nevada-Pacific Airlines, Northwest Airlines, the Ryan School of Aeronautics, Southwest Airways, Transcontinental and Western Air, United Airlines, West Coast Airlines, Western Airlines and Empire Airlines.

The board had before it, as final arguments began, recommendations of Examiner F. Merritt Ruhlen, which included the following:

## OFFICER OF YACHT CLUB DIES IN FIRE

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 22 (AP)—A yacht club officer was burned to death and \$90,000 worth of boats and equipment destroyed yesterday when flames razed the moorage of the Portland Yacht Club.

The charred body of George T. Large, 45, Portland, vice commodore of the club, was identified by dental plates after it was found in the ruins of one of five bathhouses.

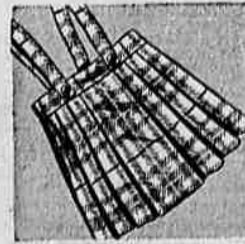

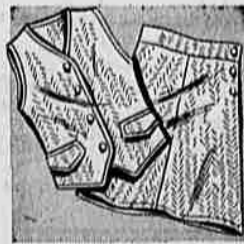
