

# SAFETY WEEK LAYS STRESS ON HAZARDS

"The average driver will avoid accidents when specific hazards are called to his attention."

That statement, according to Robert S. Farrell Jr., state chairman for the Oregon Safety Week program, October 22-28, is one of the principles upon which accident prevention activities are founded.

Obviously, no driver deliberately gets himself into an accident, Farrell explained, "but all too frequently, drivers are involved in accidents as a result of failure to understand the nature of certain hazards. Once he is consciously aware of them, he is inclined to take the necessary steps to avoid them."

**Many Accident Hazards**  
On this premise, accident prevention agencies in every field of safety, home, farm, industry, school and traffic, are concentrating their activities on calling attention to the many accident hazards in every day life during Oregon Safety Week, October 22-28.

"A campaign of one week's duration is of no consequence unless it is a special part of a continuing program," the State Safety Week chairman said. "Safety Week in Oregon therefore, is merely the vehicle by which safety agencies which conduct year-around programs obtain special emphasis on certain points of their programs."

"Those active in the field of accident prevention know that accidents can be prevented. We know that individuals will avoid accidents once they are satisfied in their own minds that certain actions lead to trouble. So, during the week of October 22-28, we are laying special emphasis on some of these hazards."

Oregon Safety Week is sponsored by all safety agencies in the state. It is the second annual event of its kind in the state.

## PERMIT SOUGHT FOR NEW RADIO STATION

Inland Radio, Inc., will this week file an application with the federal communications for a permit to construct a modern radio station in the Snake river valley. The application requests permission to build the transmitter and tower on a site near Ontario with studios in Weiser, Payette and Ontario.

Inland Radio, Inc., is now the owner and operator of Stations KBRK in Baker and KLEB, La Grande.

Principal stockholders of the corporation are State Senator Marshall E. Cornett of Klamath Falls, who is president, and Lee W. Jacobs of Baker, who is the general manager. Senator Cornett is a Klamath Falls businessman and represents five southern and central Oregon counties in the Oregon state senate. Jacobs has been a resident of eastern Oregon for 20 years and has been operating local radio stations for the past five years. He formerly lived here.

Jacobs advised that the commission now has over 1000 applications before it for consideration, so early action on the focal application is not expected. He did state that if and when favorable action is forthcoming, construction will start immediately. The corporation expects to invest approximately \$30,000 in the new station.

Call letters applied for are KSRV, indicating Snake River valley.
