## New Version Of "Les Miserables"

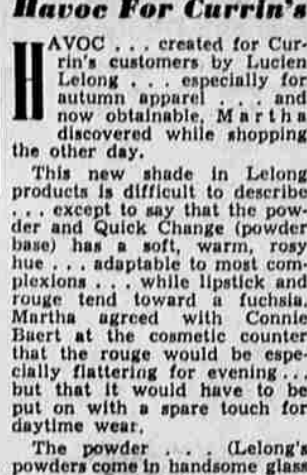
