

# STRIKE VOTE PLANNED BY CIO STEEL WORKERS

CIO-UAW vice president, said he was still hopeful of settling the wage issue with General Motors but he asserted the union would stand firm on its demand unless General Motors proves its claim of inability to meet the demand with "cost factors and other kinds of figures." The wage conferences have been adjourned indefinitely.

In the vote by 22,304 of more than 98,000 eligible Chrysler employees, 19,870 favored a strike, 2359 opposed and 75 votes were voided. General Motors results showed 70,853 favoring a stoppage to 12,438 against. About 200,000 eligible employees did not vote.

Prospects were brighter today in the long strike of movie workers in Hollywood as producers and union leaders agreed over the strike settlement terms which were announced earlier this week in Cincinnati by the AFL executive committee.

Picketing ended at all studios and movie strike committee spokesmen said that "all locked out workers" were returning to their jobs.

One of the newest stoppages affected 5000 employees of the General Electric company's Philadelphia plant. They were made idle after 800 night shift workers walked out in a dispute over a new contract.

**Strike Vote**  
A strike vote among employees of all plants of the Firestone Tire and Rubber company has been requested by the CIO-United Rubber Workers, I. H. Watson, president of Firestone's Akron local, said today. He said UAW locals at Firestone's Los Angeles, Memphis and Akron plants have filed petitions with the NLRB in Washington for a company-wide strike ballot.

In St. Louis, O. H. Brase, president of the American Train Dispatchers' association, said that nearly all of the 130 train dispatchers of the Missouri Pacific's railway system had voted to strike, although no time was set for the walkout. He said the dispute centered around demands that dispatching of trains be done solely by trained dispatchers.

# LEGISLATION TO CUT TAXES OKED

largely applying to luxuries and semi-luxuries, will remain in effect until six months after formal proclamation of the end of the war.

The new individual income tax formula makes three changes in the present law.

1. On the normal tax, taxpayers are granted the same exemptions governing the graduated surtax—\$500 each for the taxpayer and each dependent.

2. Each bracket of the surtax

is reduced by 3 percentage points.

3. After computing the tax under those conditions, the taxpayer is allowed to deduct 5 percent of his bill.

For corporations, the conferees ordered a reduction of 4 percentage points in the combined normal and surtax on corporations with income up to \$50,000. Firms making more than that amount would be allowed a cut of two percentage points.
