

Jewish Elements Blamed For Palestine Terrorism

 LONDON, Nov. 2 (AP)—Field Marshal Lord Gort resigned today as high commissioner of turbulent Palestine as the British government laid the blame for terrorism there on Jewish elements.

Colonial Secretary George Hall described the most widespread and highly organized sabotage in the history of the country as a "dastardly series of outrages" resulting from "very careful planning by a very considerable organization among Jewish communities."

In nearby Egypt, anti-Zionist elements started a general strike in Cairo on this anniversary of the Balfour declaration, demanding that the Jews be awakened "from their dream of a home in Palestine." Street fighting broke out, Police fired in the air attempting to disperse crowds.

Arab sections of Palestine also started a general strike against the Balfour declaration and Zionist aims. Arab shops closed and prayers were called in the mosques.

Hall told commons Lord Gort resigned because he was ill and that a successor would be named as soon as possible. J. V. W. Shaw, chief secretary, will administer the Palestine government in the interim.

Resort to Force
 Hall expressed regret "that there would be this wanton resort to force" while the British were examining all means to solve the Jewish-Arab problem. He said there were sufficient forces in Palestine to deal with the uprisings but "both the Palestine police and the forces have a difficult and delicate task to perform."

A Jerusalem dispatch said sketchy service was resumed on the railroads which had been cut in 153 places 24 hours before in a nationwide wave of sabotage. At least three saboteurs were known to have been killed in terrorist attacks. Two were slain when they tried to set off explosives at the Haifa Oil Refinery, the British military said.

Apparently there was no direct connection between Lord Gort's resignation and the dis-

turbances, however. Making the announcement, George Hall, secretary for the colonies, said the high commissioner had stepped down because of ill health.

A curfew was imposed yesterday in Palestine after a night in which railways were cut in at least 20 places and explosions were set off at widely scattered points.

Street Fighting
 Street fighting broke out in downtown Cairo today, coinciding with the beginning of a general strike by anti-Zionist elements who distributed pamphlets demanding that the Jews be awakened "from their dream of a home in Palestine." Police fired shots in the air in attempts to disperse the crowds.

In Palestine, the Palestine Post said the outbursts there indicated the Jews "have gone over from defensive to offensive action" in their campaign for the lifting of British white paper quota restrictions on Jewish immigration. The newspaper said the acts represented "a new step in defiance which the Jewish people were driven to proclaim because it was clear that the white paper, far from being revoked, was to be continued in force."

Hall told commons casualties in the outbreaks in Palestine were five killed and at least eight wounded, adding that because of the widespread nature of the attacks, reports on them were incomplete.

A Jerusalem dispatch said the erection of four new Jewish settlements was begun this morning in Palestine, two in Galilee, and the other two in the coastal plain between Tel Aviv and Haifa.

TOWNSPEOPLE RUSH TO RESCUE PLANE

REDMOND, Ore., Nov. 2 (AP)—Townfolk here lost no time speeding to the rescue of a B-24 bomber unable to land last night on the darkened Redmond army air field—now closed.

Word spread quickly that the big Liberator circling the field was in trouble. Soon more than 200 autos, three fire trucks, and an emergency first aid car were lined up along the 7000-foot runway, headlights blazing.

The plane, carrying a crew of four, cruised to a perfect landing. Lt. G. W. Shane, pilot, said the bomber had only three hours' fuel left and could not reach Portland because of bad weather. The B-24 was en route from McChord Field, Wash. to Oklahoma City.
