

Methodist Church In Second Phase Of Crusade For Christ

The First Methodist church here is entering upon the second phase of Methodism's Crusade for Christ which is a world-wide movement of the Methodist church. The Rev. Victor Phillips, local minister, says, "This is the most gigantic task ever undertaken by any church in a four-year period." The first phase of the crusade was the raising of \$25,000,000 for world relief and reconstruction. This effort was climaxed on March 4th of this year when, in a few months, the financial goal was over-subscribed by \$2,000,000.

First Methodist church of Klamath Falls raised approximately \$2000 of this amount, over-subscribing its quota by a substantial margin.

The second phase of the crusade which is now beginning

is a program of evangelism in which an effort will be made to reach non-resident members and bring them into membership and active relationship in the churches where they live, to reach other church members who have become inactive, and to reach the millions of "un-churched" people in the villages, towns and cities of America. This includes a program for youth. The whole church has set a goal of 1,000,000 new members and 500 new churches. In preparation for the First Methodist church's share in this task, the Rev. Victor Phillips will conduct an evangelistic preaching campaign. His subject for Sunday morning at 11 o'clock will be, "If the Foundations Be Destroyed." The choir will sing special music. The public is invited.

Series Of Sermons Will Be Started

At the Community Congregational church, Rev. Godfrey Matthews, minister, will commence a series of sermons entitled "About Man and God" on Sunday morning when he preaches on "The Man Whose God Is Several Sizes Too Small For Him."
