

Henley Gets 13-7 Win Over Merrill

Hornets Will Play Mustangs Tomorrow For County Laurels

Henley defeated Merrill high school gridder Tuesday afternoon at Merrill, 13-7, to move in to first place in the county school football race with two wins and no losses in county competition.

Hess drew first blood for Henley in the initial quarter, going over from the eight after his mauls had moved the ball all the way down the field in short gains.

In the second period Merrill came back and took the lead temporarily. Noonan snagged a Henley pass and loped 50 yards for a touchdown. The conversion was good and Merrill led, 7 to 6, at the half.

Then in the third quarter Hammond broke loose on the first play for a 60-yard run across the double stripe, but the play was called back. The whistle had blown while Hammond was spinning after being hit near the line of scrimmage.

Hess again scored, this time on a short back from the five, the last quarter, giving Henley their margin of victory.

Tomorrow afternoon Henley and Mallin play at Mallin in a game to decide the county championship. Mallin is also undefeated in district play.

Cougars Lead Grid League On Offense

SEATTLE, Nov. 15 (AP)—Statistics compiled on the Pacific Coast Football conference to date show the Washington State Cougars ahead in first downs, total yardage and yardage gained from passes.

The Cougars have gained 1573 yards in seven games, 657 of them by air and piled up 71 first downs. The Staters also lead in pass attempts with 118 and completions with 51. Twenty-two Cougar aerials have been intercepted, also tops in that department.

Oregon, also with seven games played, leads in rushing with 960 yards to 918 for WSC, and 903 for Washington, only other team to play seven games.

Washington is second in total rushing with 1378 yards in passing with 470 yards, and in first downs with 66. In these categories Oregon was 1366 yards, 406 yards and 58 first downs. Oregon State, with five games played, has gained 1162 yards and made 53 first downs.

UCLA is the only club which has not had a pass intercepted, but it has tried 31 in three games and completed only five. Idaho has tossed 68 in four games, completing 18 and losing four by interception.

Penalties of 300 yards have been levied against the Cougars, with Oregon second at 241 yards and Southern California third with 191 in four games.

Oregon State has done the most passing, with an average of 22.6 attempts per game. It has completed 42 of these 113 heaves.

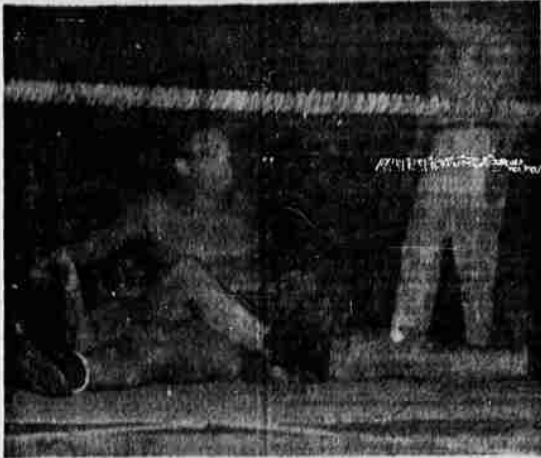
BLAZING PROOF

Phil Cavaretta Voted NL's Most Valuable

NEW YORK, Nov. 15 (AP)—Phil Cavaretta of the Chicago Cubs, who hit an unofficial .355 during the past season and then whaled the ball for a .423 mark in the world series against Detroit, has been voted the National league's most valuable player for 1945 by an overwhelming margin.

The 29-year-old first baseman received 15 first place votes, seven seconds and one fifth out of 24 ballots cast by a committee representing the Baseball Writers' association. He will be the second recipient of the Kenesaw Mountain Landis memorial plaque, which first was awarded last year to Marty Marion, St. Louis Cardinals shortstop.

Cavaretta's total of 279 points out of a possible 336 placed him far in front of Tommy Holmes of the Boston Braves, who ran second with 175. The two battled for the National league batting championship most of the season, with Cavaretta winning out in the stretch.

Charley (Red) Barrett, St. Louis pitcher who won 23 games, placed third with 151 points, and Andy Pafko, Cubs centerfielder, was fourth with 131. George "Whitney" Kurowski of the Cards ran fifth with 90 points.

Although Holmes led the National league with 28 home runs and was the circuit's only batter to collect more than 200 hits, he

was voted most valuable by only three writers as against the 15 who favored Cavaretta.

The Cubs' star made a great impression not only by his hustle and fine all-around play during the regular season, but also by his spectacular fielding and steady hitting in the world series.

In 132 games Cavaretta batted 177 hits, including 33 doubles, 10 triples and six home runs.

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Tornado Plays North Bend For Title Tomorrow

Both Squads Unbeaten, Medford Odds-On Favorite Going In

Oregon's last prep district crowns will be awarded this weekend in a crucial gridiron round that also winds up two leagues' seasons and selects "B" school semi-finalists.

Hood River, only undefeated team in district 1, was ordered by the district football committee to play Vale for the championship tomorrow night at Hood River. Vale, champion of the Snake River Valley conference, has lost one game.

A quartet of schools with perfect records clash in the laurel battles. Cottage Grove, southern subdivision titlist, and McMinnville, northern subdivision titlist, collide at Cottage Grove Saturday afternoon for the district 3 crown.

Medford's Black Tornado, undefeated in two seasons, will play the other unbeaten southern Oregon school, North Bend, at the latter's home field tomorrow afternoon for the district 2 title.

Medford, defending state champion which has piled up 452 points to opponents' 7 in eight games, goes into the fray a heavy favorite over North Bend. The Loggers' record stands 175-53, with several opponents beaten by Medford by much larger margins.

The Cottage Grove-McMinnville tilt is tougher to pick. Both have the same aggregate score of 175 after six victories, and have played none of the same teams. Cottage Grove, unbeaten in two seasons, holds a better defensive record; only 13 points against them, to McMinnville's 33.

The semi-finals for the state B championship will be played this weekend. Tift, district 1 titlist, will meet Reedsport, district 2 titlist, at Corvallis tomorrow afternoon. Moro, district 3 winner, entertains Enterprise, district 4 champion, the same day. Winners will clash later for the championship.

Tri-county league play winds up this weekend, with leader Cottage Grove entertaining Lebanon tomorrow, and Roseburg going to Sweet Home. The final game in the No-Name league, whose championship is held by Corvallis, will be played by Springfield at Salem.

Coaches Picked For Annual East-West Tilt

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 15 (AP)—Once again it will be Andy Kerr at the helm for the east and Orin E. "Babe" Hollingbery for the west in the 21st annual east-west football game played in Kezar stadium for the Shriner's crippled children's hospital.

Dr. William M. Coffman announced yesterday that arrangements for the New Year's classic were completed with signing of the coaching staff.

Kerr, of Colgate, will be assisted by Bernie Bierman of Minnesota and Beattie Feathers of North Carolina State college. The easterners will gather at Northwestern university at Evanston, Ill., and arrive in San Francisco December 20. They will train at Santa Clara university.

Hollingbery, former head coach at Washington State college and now a Pacific northwest business man, will be aided by Percy Lacey of Oregon State college.

Search Launched For Missing Hellicat

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 15 (AP)—Army and coast guard units today opened an intensive search for a navy Hellicat which left Medford, Ore., yesterday afternoon in a flight of nine planes bound for Red Bluff, Calif., and was reported missing last night by 12th naval district headquarters.

Bad weather disrupted the flight. One pilot bailed out safely at Etna, Calif., others landed without incident at various northern California fields.

Louis To Don Gloves For Pair Of Setups
SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 15 (AP)—Joe Louis, king of the heavyweights, will publicly don the gloves for the first time since his discharge from the army when he appears tonight in a four-round exhibition against two opponents.

Louis, using over-sized gloves, will box against Al "Big Boy" Brown and Jack "Sugar Lip" Robinson, both of Detroit, going two rounds against each one.

The Brown Bomber has been drawing large crowds acting as guest referee on northern California fight cards since he left the army several weeks ago. He will receive 45 per cent of tonight's gate receipts.

90,000 May See Uclans Meet Gaels
LOS ANGELES, Nov. 15 (AP)—As the Bruins put the finishing touches on some new offensive wrinkles, UCLA business officials announced today a near sell-out crowd of 90,000 was likely for Saturday's game with St. Mary's.

The year's high at the Coliseum is 81,000 for the UCLA-USC opener.

Coach Bert La Brucherie again drilled Ernie Case and Jack Porter on passing yesterday and several new plays were added to the Bruin repertoire. The Bruin mentor cased up a bit on the contact scrimmaging and was expected to begin tapering off in today's practice.

Bids Will Open For Swimming Pool
EUGENE, Nov. 15 (AP)—Bids for \$40,000 worth of bonds for construction of a municipal swimming pool will be opened December 10 by city council, City Manager Deane Seeger said today.

Seeger said work on the pool would be ready to begin by the spring.

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Boxers Ready For Smoker

Ten high school boxers are working out these afternoons at the Marine Barracks gymnasium, getting in trim for a possible display of talent before the one and only Jack Dempsey Saturday night. Four of the lads will tangle in two bouts on the smoker card and four marine leather pushers will have the spotlight for the other two bouts.

The fights, strictly amateur type with room for plenty of action and not much chance of anyone getting hurt, are to be of three one and one-half minute rounds duration. Jack Dempsey will referee. This smoker is being spark-plugged by the Victory Loan drive's special events committee.

General admission will be by bond, one \$25 bond per seat, and 200 ringside spots are going at a \$200 Roosevelt memorial bond each. Marines get in free. The seating capacity of the gym is being reshuffled and about 2500 fans will be able to crowd in Saturday night.

Wally Hyde, marine boxing coach, is selecting the four civilian and four marine boxers who will compete. At present his matchings are only tentative. Of the high school fighters, Ben Devore and Bob Hamilton, both 17-year-olds, may tangle in one of the two bouts.

The marine card will put John Childs in the ring against Tom Boehmer at 150 pounds, and George Tenhaaf and Joe Townsend together in the light-heavy bracket. Tenhaaf hits the scales at 170, while Townsend will outweigh him by 15 pounds. The show starts at 8 o'clock.

Cage Tourney Voted In Again
Again this season, after the regular schedule, high school basketball teams from Klamath Falls, Medford, Ashland and Grants Pass will meet in a Southern Oregon conference tournament at Ashland to decide what outfit will represent the district in state championship matches.

Medford, last year's victor, voted against continuation of the tourney on the grounds that during the season the top team of the four will become evident, so why toss them all together again in a superfluous meet before naming the district titlist.

Last year the Tornado had an undefeated season going into the conference tourney, then had a bad day, met a hot Pelican quintet and had a rough time squeezing out a three-point win in overtime periods. Therefore Medford isn't at all enthused over another meet of the sort.

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
