

BOY SCOUTS SLATE MASS RALLY MEET

Transportation News

SP TRACK WORKERS URGENTLY NEEDED

A critical need for track workers to replace thousands of Mexican nationals returning to their homeland with the war's end was announced by L. B. McDonald, vice president in charge of operations for Southern Pacific company.

By arrangement with United States and Mexican authorities, more than 13,000 Mexican nationals were employed by the SP at one time during the latter period of the war to relieve the manpower shortage. Thousands of these workers have already gone home and the others are being repatriated as their contracts expire. Replacements must be found, it was pointed out, to carry on vital track maintenance work. Workers are also needed in the railroad's shops and supply department.

In addition, thousands of skilled workers are needed to help meet the transportation job resulting from the return and re-deployment of troops, and reconversion of plants to peacetime activity. In particular demand are mechanics, brakemen, switchmen, signalmen and carpenters.

BOEING AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS NORMAL

SEATTLE, Nov. 15 (P)—Boeing Aircraft company reported operations normal at its Seattle and Renton plants today despite a walkout of members of the Supervisors association which started late yesterday in a jurisdictional dispute with the Aeronautical Machinists Industrial district lodge. David Lombard, association treasurer, estimated 80 per cent of the association's more than 600 members were "on vacation" today.

Association members protest a ruling preventing supervisors from taking jobs with the company which require membership in the Machinists' union. Lombard said no picket line would be established.

Whitefish Spawn In Trapper Creek

CASCADE SUMMIT—Again the time of the year when the whitefish are in Trapper creek to spawn has arrived. The first school of fish this season was sighted Sunday. The fish are now protected by law as they have been declared a game fish.

Formerly the banks were lined with people dipping out the fish. Twenty years ago the fish were so plentiful that they crowded each other out on the banks. People abused the sport of catching them and dipped them out in such large quantities that truck loads were taken out to be used for fertilizer.

Talks Continue On Bus Drivers' Strike

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 15 (P)—Negotiations on the overland Greyhound bus drivers' strike continued here today, with a few difficulties settled.

The AFL drivers and company representatives reached agreement on grievances arising from back pay disputes and discipline cases. Negotiations on the wage question, cause of the strike, probably will continue several days.
