PRE-PH WORKINGS BARED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15 (AP)—Japanese envoys in Washington reported to Tokyo the day before Pearl Harbor that they had been working with "influential individuals behind their 'front negotiations' with President Roosevelt and Secretary of State Hull.

This was disclosed today in the release by the congressional committee investigating the Pearl Harbor disaster of intercepted diplomatic messages sent by the Japanese between July 1 and Dec. 8, 1941.

FARM ELECTIONS TAKE SPOTLIGHT

In the next several weeks Oregon farmers will be joining others from coast to coast in going to the polls to elect their Triple A committeemen for 1946. By December 15, some 90,000 community and 9000 county committeemen will be chosen to administer Triple A programs during the coming year. In Oregon, the 30,000 eligible farmers will elect 1100 committeemen.

N. E. Dodd, Baker county farmer and director of the department of agriculture's field service branch, points out that any farmer who has cooperated in the Triple A program is eligible to vote in his community election meeting. Mr. Dodd said: "I hope that every eligible farmer will cast his ballot for the men he wants to represent him under the farm program. The year 1946 will be an important one, and committeemen will have many vital decisions to make. They should be the best leaders to be found in each community. Voting for our representatives is democracy's way of making sure that every farmer's voice is heard."

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15 (AP)—Oregon land under cultivation has increased 10.2 per cent in the last five years, from 17,988,307 acres to 19,826,891, the U. S. bureau of census said today. The national increase in farming areas was 10 per cent. The state of Washington expanded cultivated land 10.8 per cent. The bureau pointed out a trend toward consolidation of farms. At present, the bureau said, there are 86,000 less farms

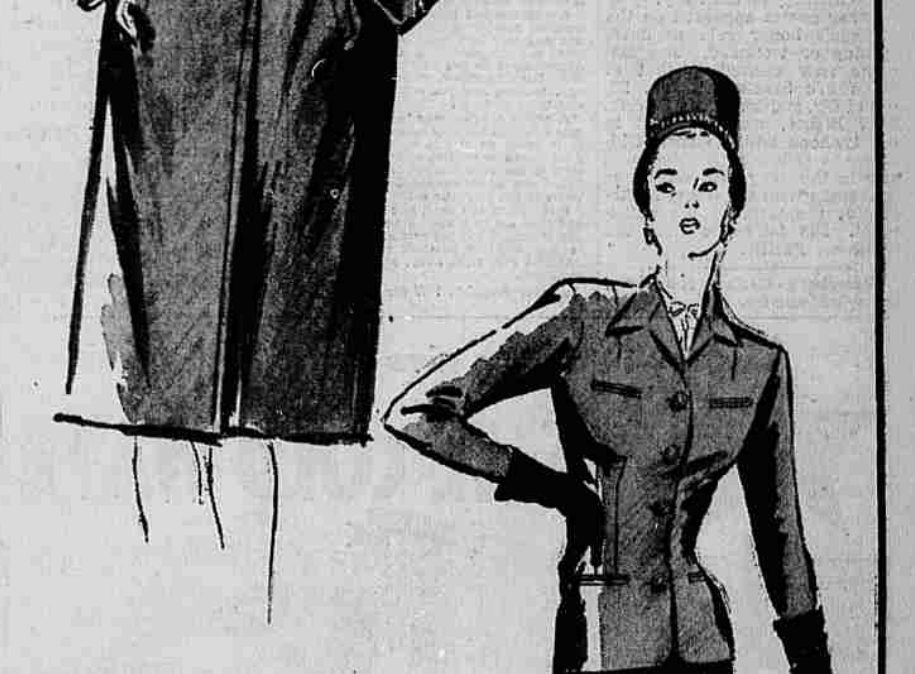
