

"Magic Eye" Decreed Death To 400 Filipinos

MANILA, Nov. 15 (AP)—Four hundred residents of the towns of Polo and Oundo in Bulacan province, just north of Manila, were selected for death at the hands of Japanese by a mysterious, hooded informer called "The Magic Eye," a witness testified at the war crimes trial of Lt. Gen. Tomoyuki Yamashita today.

Mrs. Felicidad Manuel, mother of two of the victims, said twenty truck loads of Japanese troops, supported by two tanks and a number of bloodhounds, surrounded the villages on December 12, 1944, and paraded the inhabitants past the informer.

As each passed, a silent nod or shake of the hooded head settled the fate of the individual.

Sons Executed
The witness said she was unable to find her two sons, who had been marked for death in the piles of dead at the local cemetery when she searched the next day. They had been executed in the Polo Municipal building.

Mrs. Manuel admitted under defense cross-examination that guerrillas had been very active in the area.

Earlier, Master Sgt. Richard Sakakida, a Hawaiian born Nisei who was captured by the Japanese on Corregidor and later made a civilian interpreter in Yamashita's Baguio headquarters, testified that in one month 1800 persons, including at least six Americans, were executed by the Japanese at Manila's north cemetery.

Most of those executed were Filipino civilians but two were American mining engineers, ordered killed for suspected guerrilla activities, and others were leading Spanish residents.

Sgt. Sakakida said he was warned recently by Yamashita's judge advocate, now a prisoner of war, not to appear as a witness. The warning, he testified, was given a few days ago when he saw the judge advocate, a Colonel Nishiharu, at a prisoner of war camp here.

TWO SEXTON BOYS WAR CASUALTIES

First and last casualties reported from among the 110 men enlisted in the service from the Klamath division of the Great Northern railway were young men both with the name of Sexton, residents of Klamath Falls but not related.

The first casualty among the GN employees was that of young S. J. Joseph Sexton, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Sexton, reported missing August 9, 1942, when the Jarvis mysteriously disappeared while operating in waters around Guadalcanal. No trace of the Jarvis has been received, according to navy reports. This past summer, the Sextons were advised that their son must be presumed dead. He was firing for the Great Northern just before enlisting in the navy.

Other names appeared on the division's honor roll as dead, missing or wounded. The last name now carried is that of MOM 3/c Stanley Sexton, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. P. Sexton, 3317 Bisbee, who was lost in the typhoon which struck Okinawa in October. Stanley was also in the navy. He served as brakeman with the Great Northern at the time of his enlistment. His father is with the Southern Pacific.

Dr. Rozendal Gives Tips On Keeping Fit As Fiddle

Several cases of chickenpox are reported in the county, some light cases of scarlet fever, as well as numerous colds and sore throats.

Children who complain of not feeling well should be kept at home, Dr. Rozendal advises parents. If they are put on the bus for school, chances are they will have to wait for the bus to go home, as facilities are not available for taking them home during the day, he said. Contagion is likely to spread among the other children on the bus and in classes.

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U. S.-FRANCE BEGIN TALKS ON CONTROL

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15 (AP)—The United States and France have begun talks here on the most critical issue now blocking effective allied administration of Germany: France's proposal for non-German control of the Ruhr and Rhineland.

This became known today amid strong indications that President Truman and Secretary of State Byrnes are about ready to undertake a sweeping review of American administration in Germany.

Their objective will be to try to work out some means of preventing explosive conditions in the Reich from getting worse as winter sets in.

Mr. Truman scheduled a conference today with Byron Price, a special presidential emissary who is just back from a study of the broad question of relations between the battered German people and the American occupation forces.

Similarly the return of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower has afforded the war and state departments, as well as the White House, an opportunity for a further check on critical German conditions already outlined during the recent conferences here

of Lt. Gen. Lucius Clay, Eisenhower's deputy, and Ambassador Robert Murphy, his chief political advisor.

Eisenhower himself, in a recent report from Berlin, stressed the gravity of the situation, cautioning that there may be open revolt in Germany in the months immediately ahead.
