

3 Killed, Scores Hurt As Jews Defy Curfew

JERUSALEM, Nov. 15 (AP)—J. V. Shaw, British acting high commissioner for Palestine, issued a "punishment by death" warning today to rioters in the all-Jewish city of Tel Aviv, where street demonstrations broke out for the second day.

At least one person was killed and 50 were reported injured today as thousands of persons milled in the streets defying a curfew order imposed after last night's outbreaks which resulted in the death of two Jews and the injury of 27 persons.

Unruly crowds again attacked government property, stoned barricades and stormed against several British buildings.

Resistance

The general disobedience of the curfew order appeared to be a part of the policy of resistance ordered by the secret Jewish resistance movement against continuation of the British policy of restricted Jewish immigration into Palestine.

The first casualties developed last night when troops of the British sixth parachute (Red Devils) division fired to break up crowds.

The troops were withdrawn temporarily, but were rushed back into the city today when crowds stoned the police trucks firing. Gunfire was continuing.

Shaw's warning was read in Hebrew at 1:30 p. m. over the Palestine radio. It said:

Warning

"Unruly, incitements to violence or disorder and all attempts to disrupt peace and interfere with the normal lives of the people will be punished with the utmost vigor of the law.

"Unlawful carrying or use of firearms, bombs, grenades or other warlike stores is punishable with death."

An appeal for discipline and observance of curfew orders by Dr. Israel Rockach, mayor of Tel Aviv, was read during the same broadcast. The appeal was addressed principally to the youth of Tel Aviv.

These forms are received at the bureau in the town indicated by servicemen as the place they would like to make their homes. Almeter checked through 100 random forms one day and found 36 of the men were not original Klamathites. He found another 60 forms he checked 41 per cent were men who had lived in other states before the war. These men had either been stationed in Klamath Falls at one time, visited here, or heard of the Klamath basin through friends, and decided to make this their home.

That Klamath Falls has a definite post-war future, is the opinion of Jack Almeter, manager of the U. S. employment bureau, who bases his belief upon a survey of military forms on discharged veterans.

Of course some of these men, Almeter said, may change their minds and locate elsewhere. These, however, can be counteracted by those who are registering at the office every day for employment, but did not indicate intention of coming here on their release papers, and so are not counted in the file forms.

Some Klamathites, too, Almeter admitted, may plan to make their homes now in other places, but he believes the percentage of these will be very small.

Fulltime Job

Two men and one woman in the local bureau spend full time interviewing veterans for employment. There is one part-time worker who helps with this work, and all the other departments in the office cooperate. Les Finley is veterans' employment officer in charge of this department.

Municipal Building Sold For \$30,000

OREGON CITY, Nov. 15 (AP)—City officials in the municipal building were packing up today after the structure sold to two Oregon City men for \$30,000.

Some municipal offices will be placed in temporary quarters until the new city hall annex is completed. The new owners of the building will have to keep temporarily—the jail.

TRIAL OF NAZI POSTPONED BY ARMY TRIBUNAL

By DANIEL DE LUCE NUERNBERG, Nov. 15 (AP)—The international military tribunal granted today a defense motion for a postponement of the war crimes trial of "dying" Gustav Krupp von Bohlen and Halbach until "his physical and mental condition permits it."

The court of the United States, Russia, Great Britain and France ordered charges in the Krupp indictment retained in the docket on the possibility that the 75-year-old armaments maker might recover sufficiently to come to court.

The tribunal quitted findings of its inter-allied medical commission that Krupp was "irremediably suffering from 'semile softening of the brain.'"

Rejected

The tribunal rejected a British prosecution contention that Krupp should be tried in absentia, ruling that "the charter envisages a fair trial."

"Where nature, rather than flight or contumacy, renders such a trial impossible, it would

not be in accordance with the interests of justice," the court ruled.

Prosecution demands of the United States, Russia and France that the name of Alfred Krupp, the industrialist's eldest son, be added to the list of indicted nazis will be considered later, the court said.

The question still was moot whether the historic trials would begin November 20 as scheduled, or be delayed until December 2, as the three powers suggesting that Alfred Krupp be indicted, had moved. Presumably, the court will decide this when it rules on the Alfred Krupp indictment.

In a surprise move, counsel for Julius Streicher, anti-semitic propagandist, withdrew his motion for a postponement and asked the court for an immediate psychiatric examination.

Butter Shortage Moving North

SEATTLE, Nov. 15 (AP)—A butter shortage currently being felt in Oregon and southwest Washington is moving north and will hit Seattle in about two weeks, Manager R. J. Waltz of Consolidated Dairy Products predicted yesterday.

He said large stockpiles of butter were being released by the army in the midwest and were being sold in that area. He added that the ceiling price on butter in the west would not justify shipment of the surplus to this area.
