USS General Gordon To Dock

TACOMA, Nov. 16 (AP)—The USS General Gordon from Korea with 5221 overseas troops aboard, including 45 officers and 179 enlisted men from the Pacific northwest, is expected to dock here this afternoon. It carries also 31 army nurses who will be taken to Fort Lawton for processing.

The Gordon's contingent will bring the total of Pacific theater veterans processed at the northeast Fort Lewis staging facility since V-J Day to 42,000.

The USS General Sturgis is due Monday from Yokohama with 434 officers and 2718 enlisted men, including 22 officers and 146 enlisted men from the Pacific northwest.

ALBANY, Nov. 16 (AP)—A special city election—petitioned for by residents who don't like their suburb's smell—will be held on a proposed bond issue to finance construction of a municipal incinerator.

A group of 153 West Albany citizens protested against the city dump, declaring it emits an "unbearable" odor. The city council authorized a contract for operation of the dump and called for the special election. Some \$20,000 would be needed for the incinerator.

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 16 (AP)—First degree murder charges were on file today against Jack Drew, 28, Chicago, and Larry Oglevie, 30, Kansas City, accused of the fatal shooting of Deputy Sheriff Al Bowe.

A joint statement was issued against the pair. No formal mention was made of 23-year-old Opal Newcomb, who had worn Drew's engagement ring only a day before the shooting.

The slender girl bookkeeper told an interviewer how Wednesday night had been planned as a quiet dinner date. She had known Drew about six years and written to him while he was in service, she said.

She and the two men had some beer at a tavern, she said, then she went out to the car.
