Supply Of Blood Plasma Exhausted

SEATTLE, Nov. 20 (AP)—Dr. Robert Anderson, resident surgeon of King county hospital, said tonight the supply of whole blood and blood plasma was exhausted and appealed for donors, saying there was no reserve for use in Seattle and King county in case of disaster.

He said the King county blood bank's reserve became exhausted when donors stopped giving blood, believing the end of the war ended the need.

"If we don't have donations at once," said Dr. Anderson, "the mortality will be high in the event of a bad fire, a train wreck or any accident in which many persons are hurt."

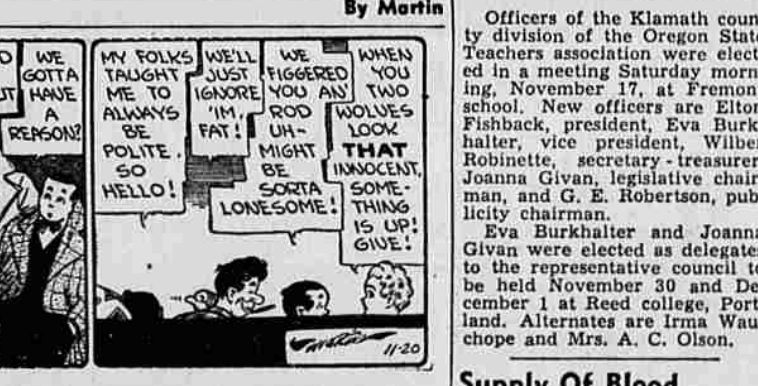

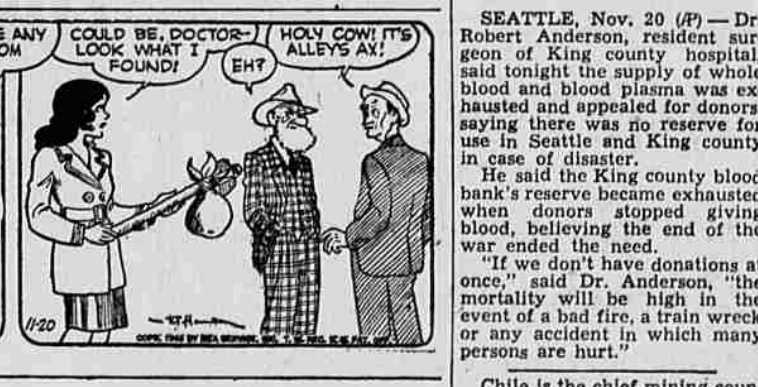
