## Prince Hal Named Top AL Player

NEW YORK, Nov. 21 (AP)—Hal Newhouser, 24-year-old pitching ace of the World Champion Detroit Tigers, today added a second straight American league most valuable player award to his harvest of laurels.

The slim Detroit native who southpawed Steve O'Neill's Bengals to a pair of series triumphs, including the seventh decision tilt with the Chicago Cubs, had a runaway in the voting of the baseball writers association.

The writers last week voted Phil Cavarretta, first baseman of the pennant-winning Chicago Cubs, as the most valuable player in the National league.

Last year Newhouser just squeezed past teammate Dizzy Trout by four points but this time the talented lefthander polled a 72-point margin over his nearest rival, second baseman Eddie Mayo, another important cog in the Tiger machine.
