

GRANT WHIPS MEDFORD 7 TO 6

Generals' Line Halts Tornado Ground Attack

Win Streak Snapped At 19 Straight; Last-Ditch Aerial Assault Fails

Medford's Black Tornado has been stopped at last. The Grant Generals of Portland, battling like the underdogs they were, crossed the goal in the final stanza of the Thanksgiving Day semi-final and captured a berth in Oregon's prep championship game by a 7-6 margin.

The rugged Grant line was the first anti-Tornado fortification that has turned up in this state for 19 games and two years. Medford, blitzing toward a second straight championship with a 1945 record of 478 points in nine games to opponents' 20, blew out before the line.

Grant will meet the winner of Saturday's semi-final between Hood River and Cottage Grove for the state football championship on Portland's Multnomah field December 1.

The Oregon small-school championship went to western Oregon in another Thanksgiving Day contest. A heavy Reedport team downed the eastern Oregon titlist, Moro, 27-0, after a listless first half.

Grant scored and converted in the final quarter to halt the Black Tornado for the first time in 19 games and two years, and capture a berth in the prep championship game.

Although the Black Tornado blew mercilessly against Grant for three quarters, it fizzled out three times within five yards of the goal. A place-kick by Darryl Davis gave the Generals the winning point.

Grant's rigid defense checked two Medford drives—to the five and the two-yard lines—during the first half. Medford scored early in the third period when Watson darted over from the five, but his kick was blocked in the final quarter. Stamen recovered Watson's fumble on Medford's 34, then Shaw's pass to Curtis carried to the 20. After a penalty sent the Generals back to the 35, another Shaw-to-Curtis pass placed the ball on the six, and Wasch ran through left tackle to score.

Medford took to the air with four minutes left and reached to within four yards of the Grant goal before the game ended.

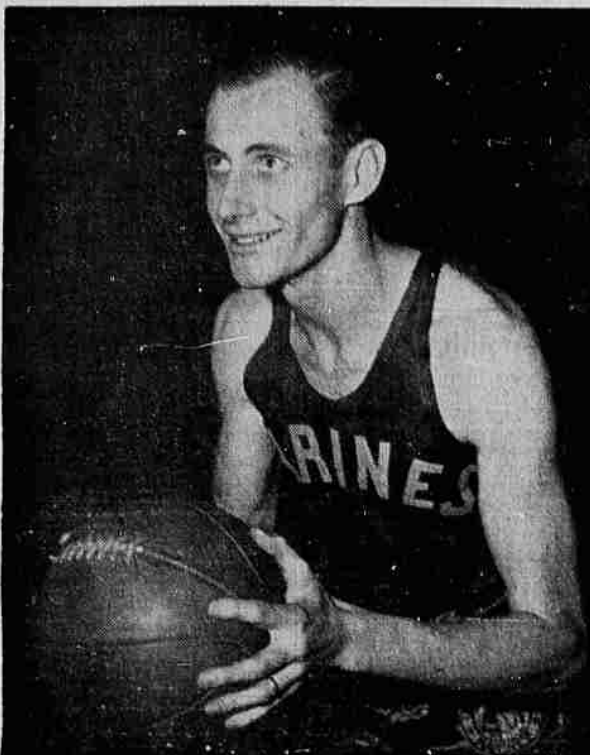

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Four Teams Have Chance At Bowl Bid

Little Possibility That Western Choice Made Before Dec. 1

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 23 (AP)—Four Pacific Coast conference teams with a mathematical chance at the tie and choice as western Rose Bowl representative meet this weekend but with little possibility the final choice will be made before the season's finale December 1.

Southern California, taking on Oregon State at Los Angeles, has a record of three games won and one lost in title play. The following weekend USC meets University of California at Los Angeles. UCLA with a record of two wins and one loss, meets University of California at Berkeley this week. Wins by USC and UCLA, both favorites, this week may set the title deciding contest between the following week.

Up north Washington and Washington State tie up tomorrow in their final conference tilt. A Washington win would make its standing seven victories and two losses. Conversely, a Washington State victory would give it a closing record of six wins and two defeats.

With those figures the statistically inclined can calculate any number of combinations giving all this week's contestants except California and Oregon a chance at the title.

Reedsport Wins 'B' Prep Title

OREGON CITY, Nov. 23 (AP)—Oregon's 1945 "B" prep football champion is Reedsport, which vanquished Moro, 27-0, yesterday after a slow-moving, scoreless first half.

The Braves managed only two first downs and Moro one during the first two periods. But Reedsport leaped into action eight minutes after the half with Clyde Dewitt racing to a touchdown from his own 28.

Dick Mooney's 35-yard pass to Dewitt gained a second tally, and John Diehl drove over from the one-yard line for another. The lighter Moro line staved off the Braves temporarily, then Dewitt sent a pass to Mooney for the final count.

The Huskies threatened in the third period, gaining a first down on Reedsport's 30-yard line from an 18-yard pass and a penalty, but failed to score. The winners made 162 yards rushing to Moro's 72.
