

Ezra Pound Indicted For 19 Acts Of Treason

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26 (AP)—Attorney General Tom C. Clark today announced that Ezra Pound had been indicted for treason on charges of broadcasting from fascist Italy during the war.

The announcement said the indictment charged 19 overt acts of treason.

Clark's announcement said the indictment cited seven dates between September 11, 1942 and May 15, 1943 on which Pound allegedly made recordings in Rome radio studios for subsequent propaganda broadcasts over the Rome radio. The indictment said these broadcasts were of a treasonable nature.

Seven Italians who claim to have seen Pound make anti-allied broadcasts from Rome and Milan flew here voluntarily two weeks ago, the announcement disclosed, to testify before the District of Columbia federal grand jury which returned the indictment.

The announcement said the indictment charged that Pound received payments from Italy for

the purpose of and with the intent to adhere to and give aid and comfort to the kingdom of Italy.

Pound originally was indicted here for treason on July 26, 1943. This indictment was based on FBI investigations and on recordings of his alleged broadcasts, picked up by the federal communications commission.

Mott Vacancy To Be Filled

SALEM, Nov. 26 (AP)—Governor Earl Snell today ordered a special election to be held in the first congressional district on Friday, January 11, to choose a successor to the late Rep. James W. Mott, Salem, who died in Bethesda, Md., November 12.

Election officials said it appears that the candidates would have to run as independents, although Attorney General George Neuner is studying whether the candidates may have their party labels printed on the ballots after their names.

The candidates could be nominated either by petitions signed by 3600 voters, or by assemblies of 250 persons.

Counties in the district are Benton, Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Lincoln, Marion, Polk, Tillamook, Washington and Yamhill.

General Wainwright Visits Ashland

ASHLAND, Ore., Nov. 26 (AP)—General Jonathan M. Wainwright and party were weekend guests of State Senator Earl Newberry (R) while en route through here to Sacramento, Calif.

Wainwright spoke Saturday night at a junior high school auditorium program where he was greeted by four Ashland survivors of Bataan and Mrs. Sidney Bartlett, a civilian prisoner of war at Manila.

Wainwright urged national preparedness to avoid repetition of the tragedy of Corregidor, Bataan and Pearl Harbor.

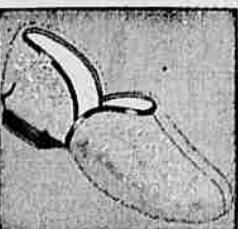

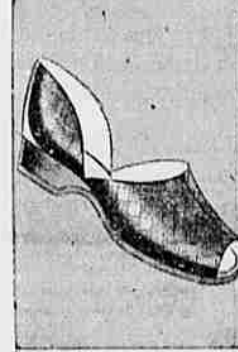
