

# Lake Chelan's Deep And Icy Waters Still Holds Bodies Of 13 Youngsters

CHELAN, Wash., Nov. 28 (AP)—Lake Chelan's deep and icy waters still held the bodies today of 13 school children and the driver of the school bus which swerved off a 20-foot embankment into the water Monday morning.

Divers have recovered two bodies but have found no trace of the bus and its grim cargo after descending 200 feet into the snow-fringed lake.

They estimated the bus might be at least 300 feet below the surface. The people of Chelan, awaiting the arrival of deep sea divers from Seattle, voiced fears that the vehicle may never be found. The lake is 500 feet deep, and a short distance from the spot where the bus struck the water.

## Ickes Sets Limit On Timber Cut

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28 (AP)—Interior Secretary Ickes today set 600,000,000 board feet as the allowable annual cut from 2,500,000 acres of federal timber land in western Oregon.

Ickes said in a statement this action established the foundation for a long-lasting timber economy.

A federal statute, directing that forest operations be carried out on a sustained-yield basis (maintenance of a balance between tree-cutting and tree-growing) stipulated that the interior secretary should determine the annual productive capacity of the area.

Ickes' declaration of 600,000,000 board feet supersedes the allowable cut of 500,000,000 board feet established temporarily by congress pending determination by the secretary.

Plans Resumed

Ickes said plans to pool public and private timber resources for cooperative sustained-yield forest management, largely suspended during the war, now would be resumed.

The plan for cooperative administration of government-owned and intermingled private lands call for the establishment of 12 master units, and the creation within these units of 107 local sustained-yield forestry management units. None of these units, however, can be established until the secretary has determined the annual productive capacity.

A public hearing will be held in Eugene, Ore., Dec. 3 to consider the establishment of the Siuslaw master unit.

Walter McCray, Seattle diver, said he would attempt to locate the bus and raise it to a level that would permit removal of the bodies. He said his equipment would permit him to descend to 400 feet, but at that depth "we couldn't stay down long enough to get out the bodies."

Storm clouds hung like the pall of death over the farming district of 25 Mile Creek, which lost nearly all its children in the accident. Just five youngsters and a woman passenger escaped, crawling through broken windows as the bus sank.

Families in the area for the most part secluded themselves, some making short trips to the scene of the tragedy, where state patrolmen were on guard to keep out the idly curious. Six families lost two children each.

Divers recovered the body of Ronald Ayers, 13, yesterday after finding that of Henry Davis, 16, the night before.

Lt. Evans pointed out the critical need for buying bonds in order to provide for hospitalization and future care of thousands of veterans of World War 2.

Sgt. P. G. Smith of the Marine Barracks did a bang-up job as master of ceremonies during the two-hour show introducing the various participants which included Irma Beasley, Mary Mahoney, Patty Meyers, Grayce VanCleave, Wells and Selby, Patty Brown, and George Willis.
