U. S. Foreign Policy Flayed

NEW DELHI, Nov. 29 (AP)—Sharp criticism of United States foreign policy was touched off today in Indian newspapers representing all shades of political opinion by the sudden resignation of Maj. Gen. Patrick J. Hurley as ambassador to China and his statements attacking state department operations.

Dawn, official organ of the Moslem league, declared that "it appears that Wikie's 'one world' ideal has come to be interpreted by the United States' power-drunk diplomats as a world dominated by America, a world in which imperialism is safely entrenched and colonialism has scope to expand, a world in which there is freedom only for big powers."

The paper declared "it will ever rebound to the discredit of America that her lend lease supplies were used for predatory objectives after World War II."

The Hindustan Times, edited by Devadas Gandhi, son of Mohandas K. Gandhi, spiritual leader of the All-India Congress party, concurred in Hurley's statement that America is being "sucked" into a power bloc on the side of colonial imperialism.

"There is a case for absolute non-intervention on the part of the United States in the present civil war in China," the newspaper said.

"There is a much stronger case for effective intervention with a view of eliminating kuomintang and communist authoritarianism and to establish real democracy in that country. We agree that the present distracted policy is the worst possible."

The English owned Statesman said Hurley, in his statement, had done good neither to the United States nor to China, and that "renascent isolationism has found a new champion."

High Ranking Nazi Arrested

NUERNBERG, Germany, Nov. 29 (AP)—The U. S. military government at Coburg today announced the arrest of Karl Eduard, duke of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, a grandson of Britain's Queen Victoria.

The duke was president of the German Red Cross and had a general's rank in the Nazi storm troops.

The Nazis used English-born Karl Eduard as a show piece to demonstrate that the German aristocracy favored the Nazi regime.

The 61-year-old duke's estate has been confiscated. Ailing and subject to attacks of gout, the duke has been placed under guard in a hospital. There was no immediate announcement of the charges under which he was being held.

Karl Eduard is regarded as one of the richest men in Germany. He speaks German with a slight English accent. His family connections include many European bloodlines.

Young Seeks To Invalidate Tax Law

SALEM, Nov. 29 (AP)—The state supreme court today received the appeal of F. H. Young, manager of Oregon and business and tax research, who seeks to invalidate the 1945 law providing for simplified forms for state income tax returns.

The appeal is from Marion County Circuit Judge George Duncanson, who denied Young's contention that the law is invalid on grounds it is not the same as the one passed by the legislature. Young contends that an error was made in a legislative committee.

Young's suit is directed against the state tax commission.
