Sleuth States Man Confesses Tavern Murder

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 5 (AP)—Detective Capt. James Fleming said today that a man arrested in a Spokane tavern holdup confessed to slaying Joe Mezzina, Portland tavern owner.

Fleming said Harold Wayne Hollister, 26, alias Bert Crenshaw, confessed after Barmald Arleta Pitter identified him as the gunman she saw shoot Mezzina here November 10.

Three Portland police detectives questioned Hollister at Spokane. He told them, Fleming said, that he was attempting to rob the tavern and fired when the tavern owner reached for a gun.

Fleming said fingerprints of Hollister and those found on a bottle in the Mezzina tavern were identical and that a Luger pistol bullet from a gun found on Hollister when he was arrested would also be evidence.

Fleming said Hollister reported leaving Portland and going to Seattle before continuing by bus to Spokane.

Truman Not To Attend Confab

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5 (AP)—The White House said flatly today President Truman has no intention of attending a foreign secretaries conference in London.

The British Press association quoted delegates to the United Nations preparatory commission as saying Mr. Truman might substitute for Secretary of State Byrnes at an early meeting of foreign ministers there.

Eben Ayres, assistant White House press secretary, told reporters that the report "is not so" and the president "has no intention" of attending such a meeting. The reported meeting would include the foreign ministers of the United States, Britain, Russia, China and France.

Gen. Marquat Named Chief Of Section

TOKYO, Dec. 5 (AP)—Maj. Gen. William F. Marquat, member of General MacArthur's staff since Corregidor, became chief of his economic and scientific section today, succeeding Col. Raymond Kramer, who is returning to the United States.

Marquat, former member of the Seattle Times staff, is 51 and a native of St. Louis, Mo. He served with MacArthur's military mission in the Philippines beginning in 1938, and accompanied the general from Corregidor to Australia. He was staff anti-aircraft officer.

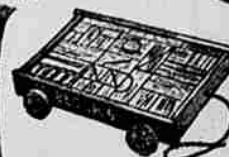

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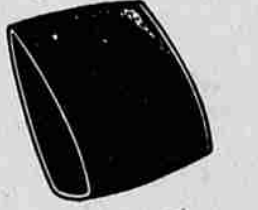
