

Parents Sing Birthday Song On Chelan Shore

CHELAN, Wash., Dec. 6 (AP)—"Happy Birthday to You," the man and woman sang as they knelt in the chill twilight on the shore of Lake Chelan, in front of them a cake whose seven candles tried hard to push back the coming darkness.

On the cake's icing was the message, "Stewart, 7," for Stewart Hale who had no birthday party yesterday because he was one of the children in the school bus which plunged into the deep lake.

His brother, Douglas, 8, also died in the tragedy.

Mr. and Mrs. Roger Hale, the parents, couldn't quite get through the song and when they could not continue slowly rose and walked from the tiny circle of light.

The tragic scene was enacted after memorial services for the victims of the accident conducted by a navy chaplain, the Rev. Murdock Hale, of Oakland,

Calif., uncle of the Hale children.

CHELAN, Wash., Dec. 6 (AP)—Chelan thought today of memorials to its dead after services were held yesterday in the town and on Lake Chelan for the 15 children and Driver Jack Randle who died when a school bus plunged from a hillside swept road November 28.

The Rev. Murdock Hale of Oakland, Calif., uncle of two boys who died in the accident—Stewart, 6, and Douglas Hale, 8—read services at the site yesterday as small boats circled to drop flowers in the water earlier, funeral services were held for five of the victims in the Masonic temple. Nine bodies have not been recovered.

Two drives for funds to provide memorials are under way. Schoolmates of the victims are campaigning among themselves to raise money for some sort of remembrance. The Chelan Business Girls club is sponsoring a drive and plans to provide "something for the betterment of children."

The club spokesman said they hoped either to provide equipment for a children's ward in the hospital here or playground equipment for Chelan's lake-shore park.

Hearings Slated On Flood Control Job

Plane Brings Triplets Home

PORTLAND, Dec. 6 (AP)—The eight weeks old, but already famous "alborne O'Brien triplets" were headed home today to Dufur, Ore., after a transcontinental air trip that ended here for the children and their parents.

The triplets, Jackie, Jean and Jerry, were the first set of triplets born in an army hospital. Their father, ex-Paratrooper Sergeant Richard O'Brien and the mother were stationed at Ft. Benning, Ga., when they were born October 10. Delivery was made at the paratrooper school hospital.

After juggling babies and bottles across the continent, the overseas combat veteran said he was "the proudest guy in the country and the biggest nervous wreck."

His pretty wife is the former Violet Odell of Springfield. She said last night at the Portland airport that 24 bottles of formula she prepared for the trip gave out at Spokane, but Northwest Airlines soon provided others.

Two Boys Held In Stolen Car Death

HILLSBORO, Dec. 6 (AP)—Two Portland boys were held by police today after a stolen car in which they and two companions were riding struck and killed 14-year-old Clarence G. Eastman, Beaverton, near here last night.

State Policeman Vernon Boyer reported he was chasing the car when it struck a bicycle ridden by the Beaverton boy. The four young occupants climbed out. Boyer halted the 15-year-old driver and a 13-year-old companion. The two other boys fled across a field.
