Man Jailed For Statutory Rape

David Samuel Van Cleave, 59, an itinerant worker who has been residing in the Midland district, was arrested yesterday and placed in the county jail on a charge of statutory rape involving his own 12-year-old daughter.

The charges were filed by the girl's mother after the girl had come to the juvenile office and made the complaint against her father.

The Van Cleave's are said to be divorced and the girl has been living with her mother. She was living with her father in October, however, when he allegedly forced his attentions upon her. Van Cleave, a shell-shocked World War I veteran, has been in various veterans hospitals and also served one year in the Walla Walla, Wash., county jail on a morals count. He was picked up by state police yesterday and is to be arraigned in justice court today.

The girl is being held in custody of the juvenile office. She will be 13 years old Sunday.

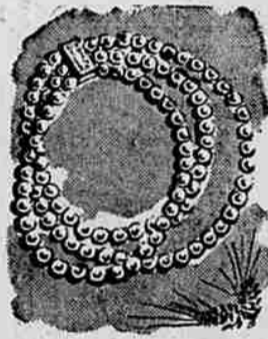
