

Klamath Prepares To Make Strong Bid For Postwar Tourist Traffic

Klamath chamber of commerce girded itself today to make a strong bid for the postwar tourist traffic, expected to set all-time records in travel in the next few years.

Chamber directors authorized publication of a new pictorial booklet on the Klamath area, and instructed Manager Charles Stark to take what trips appear necessary to make contacts with tourist bureaus, road map makers, information agencies and others who influence travel trends.

To Attend Meet
Stark was also to attend a forthcoming meeting of the

Northwest Tourist association at Butte, Mont.

There was a discussion of the need for accommodations for tourists in this area. General opinion of directors was that if the tourist travel creates a demand for more accommodations, investors will see that they are installed.

John Houston, director in charge of tourist promotion, said that the committee has learned that heavy travel from out of state is already underway in Oregon, and advised that Klamath take the necessary steps to get its share of this out-of-state business.

Master Plan
Houston pointed out that the tourist committee has a master plan, approved by the directors, which calls for ultimate employment of a field man to work on tourist development. He said this would not be done until the right man is found for the job.

Girl Killed In Car Crash

CORVALLIS, Dec. 13 (AP)—A civilian girl office worker at Camp Adair was killed last night and eight persons injured in a two-car head-on collision on the three-lane Camp Adair and Polk county highway.

The injured were in the U. S. naval hospital at the camp, but there was no report by naval hospital authorities on the condition of seven of the eight. One boy was reported not seriously hurt.

State police reported Mary Louise Reeves, 1055 N. 18th St., Salem, was killed almost instantly in the crash of a navy car into one driven by Mrs. Don Eckman, Corvallis. Police said

there were four other girls in the car driven by the sailor. Passengers with Mrs. Eckman were her son, Martin, 6, and her sister-in-law, Mrs. Lucile Dahl, Corvallis.

The navy car was passing a third automobile when it struck the Eckman car, state police reported.

How to make holiday baking easy

Time to start thinking about all those good things you can bake now and keep for holiday eating. And here are recipes for an Apple Sauce Fruit Cake and some delightful cookies... examples of how easy it is to turn those thoughts into delicious things-to-eat. No need to worry for they keep perfectly.

APPLE SAUCE FRUIT CAKE
An easy-to-make cake that will store for a number of weeks if kept in a cool, dry place.

- 2 cups flour
- 1 egg
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 cup unsweetened sieved applesauce
- 2 tps. baking powder
- 1 cup sliced candied fruit
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 3/4 cup seedless raisins
- 1/2 tsp. cloves
- 1/2 cup chopped nutmeats
- 1/4 tsp. allspice
- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1 cup brown sugar firmly packed

Sift and measure flour; sift again with salt and spices. Cream shortening and sugar until light and fluffy; beat in egg. Add applesauce and flour mixture alternately; beat until smooth. Add fruit and nutmeats. Pour into well-greased loaf pan (9x4x3) and bake in moderate oven (350° F.) for 1 hour or until done. Makes one loaf cake.

GINGERSNAPS

- 1/2 cup shortening
- 2 3/4 cups flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 egg, beaten
- 2 tps. ginger
- 1 tsp. soda
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 cup dark molasses

Cream shortening and sugar together until light and fluffy; add egg. Stir in combined soda and molasses. Sift and measure flour; sift again with cinnamon, ginger and salt. Blend well into creamed mixture. Chill about 1 hour. Shape dough into small balls between palms of hands. Place balls on lightly-greased cookie sheet about 1 1/2 to 2 inches apart. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) 15 to 18 minutes, or until done. Remove to rack and cool. Makes 5 to 6 dozen cookies.
