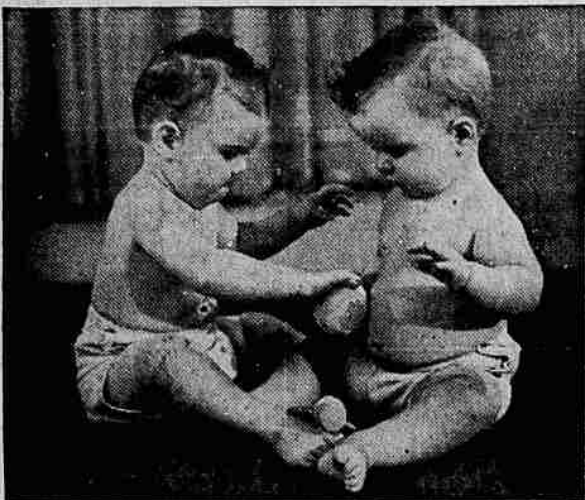
Bible Confab To End Sunday

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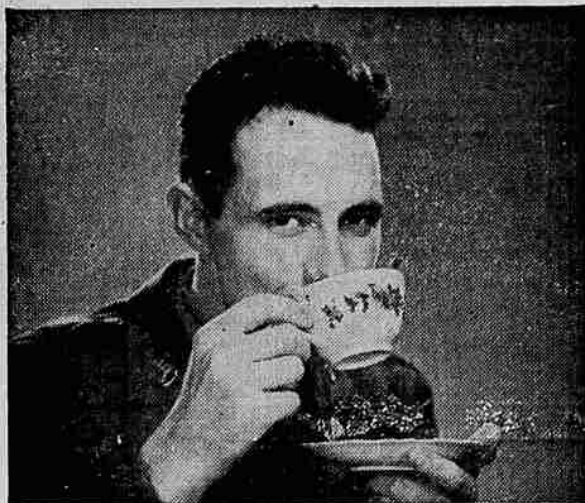

COFFEE NUT PUDDING

1 cup strong coffee
1 cup Borden's Evaporated Milk
1/2 cup sugar
3 tablespoons cornstarch

1/2 teaspoon salt
1 egg, slightly beaten
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup coarsely chopped walnuts, if desired

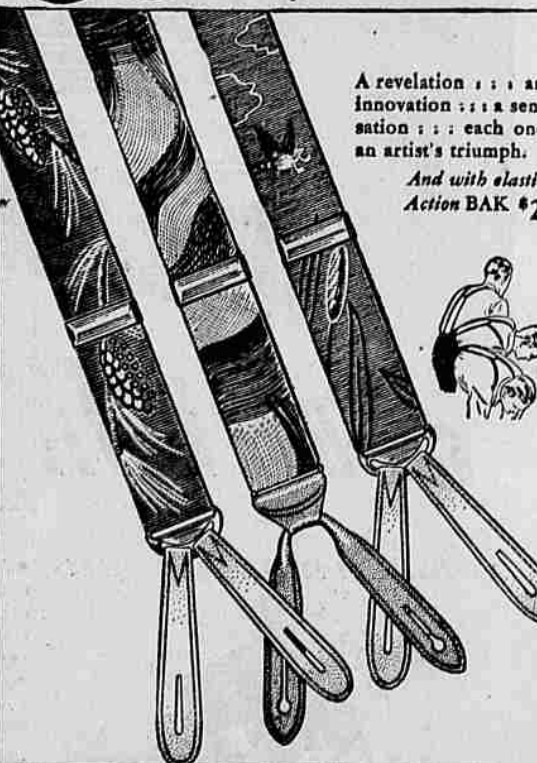
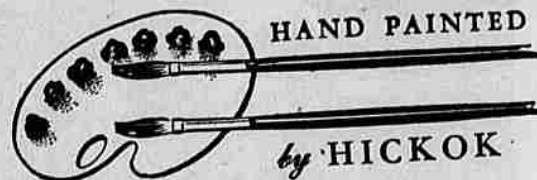
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Special Advent Service Slated
